



## What is UConn ECE?

- *UConn Early College Experience (UConn ECE) is a concurrent enrollment program that allows motivated high school students to take UConn courses at their high schools for both high school and college credit. Every course taken through UConn ECE is equivalent to the same course at the University of Connecticut. Students benefit by taking college courses in a setting that is both familiar and conducive to learning. The University of Connecticut certifies high school teachers to serve as UConn ECE Instructors and teach UConn courses. Established in 1955, UConn Early College Experience is the nation's longest running concurrent enrollment program and is accredited by The National Alliance of Concurrent Enrollment Partnerships.*
- **Mission:** *UConn Early College Experience is committed to providing access to, and preparation for, post-secondary education programs through its ability to offer University of Connecticut courses to high school students. UConn Early College Experience is committed to excellence in education by fostering a relationship between higher education and partner high schools to create an effective transition for students who have made college a goal.*

## What are the benefits of enrolling in a UConn ECE course?

- A head start in a chosen field of study and/or a head start on completing courses that are typical general education requirements necessary for future college graduation.
- A belief in your ability to succeed in college courses.

- The flexibility to study abroad, volunteer, and/or intern with a reduced course schedule due to the accumulation of credits through UConn ECE.

- The [Credit Transfer Database](#) provides information on the likelihood of the transferability of UConn credit earned through UConn ECE to a particular institution. ## Program Fees:

*UConn Early College Experience program fees are \$50 per registered course credit.*

Credit Total	Total Cost per Course
1 credit course	\$50
2 credit course	\$100
3 credit course	\$150
4 credit course	\$200

- *By registering for a UConn course through UConn ECE, students have a financial obligation to the University of Connecticut. Students are financially responsible for all courses for which they enroll and are subject to billing policies similar to those used for all UConn students.*
- ***All course fees are applied to Student accounts upon course enrollment, and bills are issued via e-mail.***
- *Failure to receive an e-mail bill notification does not absolve Students of the responsibility of payment. Students have 24/7 access to view their course requests in their student profile to determine total fees due.*
- *University standard policies on late fees, returned checks, and collections will apply.*

### PROGRAM FEE WAIVERS

*Students who take part in the Federal Free/Reduced Lunch Program are eligible for a full program fee waiver. Contact your school counselor for more information.*

Documentation verifying eligibility for the Free/Reduced Lunch Program and income verification forms for participating CEP schools must be submitted to the UConn ECE Program Office by November 7
