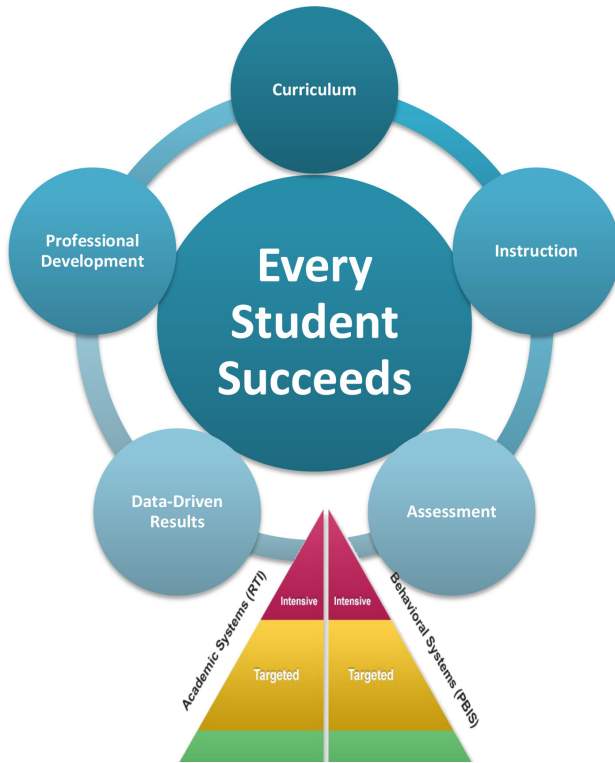


ACPS Learning and Teaching Model

The goal of ACPS is to ensure that *every student succeeds!* Teaching and learning in ACPS involves a rigorous curriculum, effective planning, balanced assessment, proven instructional strategies, and relationships with students that communicate high expectations and a commitment to student success.



ACPS uses a staff-developed 21st-century curriculum focused on helping students become critical thinkers and problem solvers. Effective Assessment and Progress Monitoring

Student data provides feedback about what students are learning and what they still need to learn. Data collected informally on a daily basis and formally at the end of units and specific milestones throughout the year help to guide learning and teaching. This data includes:

- Virginia Standards of Learning (SOL) Assessments
- Daily teacher observation and formative assessment
- Daily student work products
- End-of-unit assessments
- Normed screening instruments, including the Virginia Kindergarten Readiness Program (VKRP)
- Reading assessments such as running records and Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening (PALS)
- Common assessments in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science and Social Studies
- Transfer tasks and other forms of performance assessment and projects that emphasize student transfer of learning to real-life settings and problems

* ACPS K-5 Literacy Guidelines call for all students to receive a minimum of 60 minutes daily of explicit reading instruction on their instructional levels. If your child is reading above grade level, he or she will receive instruction above grade level. If your child is reading below grade level, ACPS will provide accelerated instruction at his or her level to rapidly close the gap. Students may be regrouped during the reading block.
