Policy Title: Credit Acceptance for Transferring Students

Public School Students:

Upon enrollment the registrar must receive an official transcript from the previous school. Students transferring from accredited public schools outside this district will receive credit toward high school graduation for those classes taken at the previous public school.

Non-Public School Students:

Upon enrollment the registrar must receive an official transcript from the previous school. Students transferring from non-public schools, including parochial and home study, will receive credit toward high school graduation for courses taken at the non-public school as follows:

1. If the non-public school is accredited by the Idaho State Board of Education or other regional accreditation agency (such as Cognia or the equivalent), the student will receive credit as awarded by the non-public school for all secular courses.
2. If the non-public school is not accredited, the student will receive credit by passing the EOCA (End of Course Assessment) exam for the course(s) in which the student wishes to receive credit. A student transferring from a non-public school may receive credit for no more than one-half (1/2) of the total credits required for graduation and for no more than one-half (1/2) of the core credits required for graduation by this district.

A student may not be granted more than a total of 24 credits.
