Series 500: Student Policy: Conduct/Discipline

Policy No. 504.9

Policy Title: Denial of School Attendance

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A student who is a habitual truant, or who is incorrigible, or whose conduct is continuously disruptive of school discipline or of the instructional effectiveness of the school, or whose presence in school is detrimental to the health and safety of other students may be expelled from school by the Board of Trustees.

The superintendent, principal or designee may temporarily suspend a student from school for disciplinary reasons or for other conduct disruptive of good order or of the instructional effectiveness of the school. A temporary suspension by the principal or designee shall not exceed five (5) school days in length.

The Board of Trustees may suspend a student from school whether or not a temporary suspension has been imposed by the principal or the superintendent, but applicable due process shall be afforded the student.

A teacher, principal, superintendent or the Board of Trustees may exclude a student from a class or classes for conduct that is disruptive of class discipline, disruptive of instructional effectiveness, destructive of school property or is detrimental to an appropriate environment for education or to the health, safety or welfare of other students.

Denial of a student's attendance or participation in a school sports program or extracurricular activity may be in accordance with the Athletic Handbook or other applicable policy or rules or regulations of the school district.

Any student who has been expelled from another school district in this state or any other state shall be denied enrollment.
