



# Penn State Hershey Medical Center – Project SEARCH

### Program Profile

#### Description

The Capital Area Intermediate Unit (CAIU) is partnered with The Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center and the Pennsylvania Office of Vocational Rehabilitation (OVR) to operate the Penn State Hershey Project SEARCH Program site at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center.

The Penn State Hershey Medical Center Project SEARCH Program features a unique, business-led, school-to-work program that takes place entirely at the workplace, Hershey Medical Center. Total workplace immersion facilitates a seamless combination of classroom instruction, career exploration, and relevant job-skills training through strategically designed internships. The goal for each student participant is competitive employment.

#### Placement Criteria

- Project SEARCH serves students with intellectual and developmental disabilities who are at least 18 years of age, have an IEP, are in their last year of high school, and have been found to be OVR eligible. The most important criterion for acceptance into Project SEARCH is a desire to achieve competitive employment.
- Participation is limited to 12 students per year. In order to be considered for the program, students must be referred by their home district, meet all eligibility requirements, submit an application and participate in an interview and skills assessment. Final selection of participants will be made by the Student Selection Team, a team composed of representatives from each of the partners, The Penn State Milton S. Hershey Medical Center, CAIU and OVR.

#### Exit Criteria

- This is a program for students who are in their final year of school. All successful participants will graduate upon completion with a goal of having obtained competitive employment.
