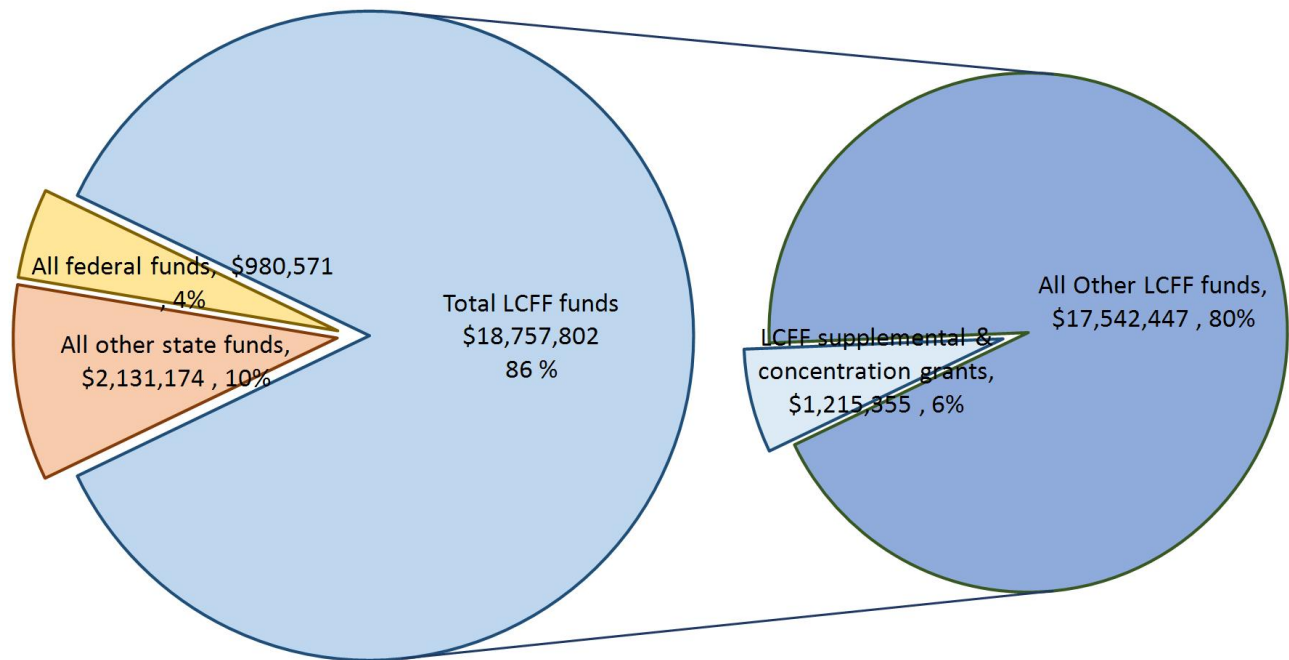

School districts receive funding from different sources: state funds under the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), other state funds, local funds, and federal funds. LCFF funds include a base level of funding for all LEAs and extra funding - called "supplemental and concentration" grants - to LEAs based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learners, and low-income students).

Projected Revenue by Fund Source



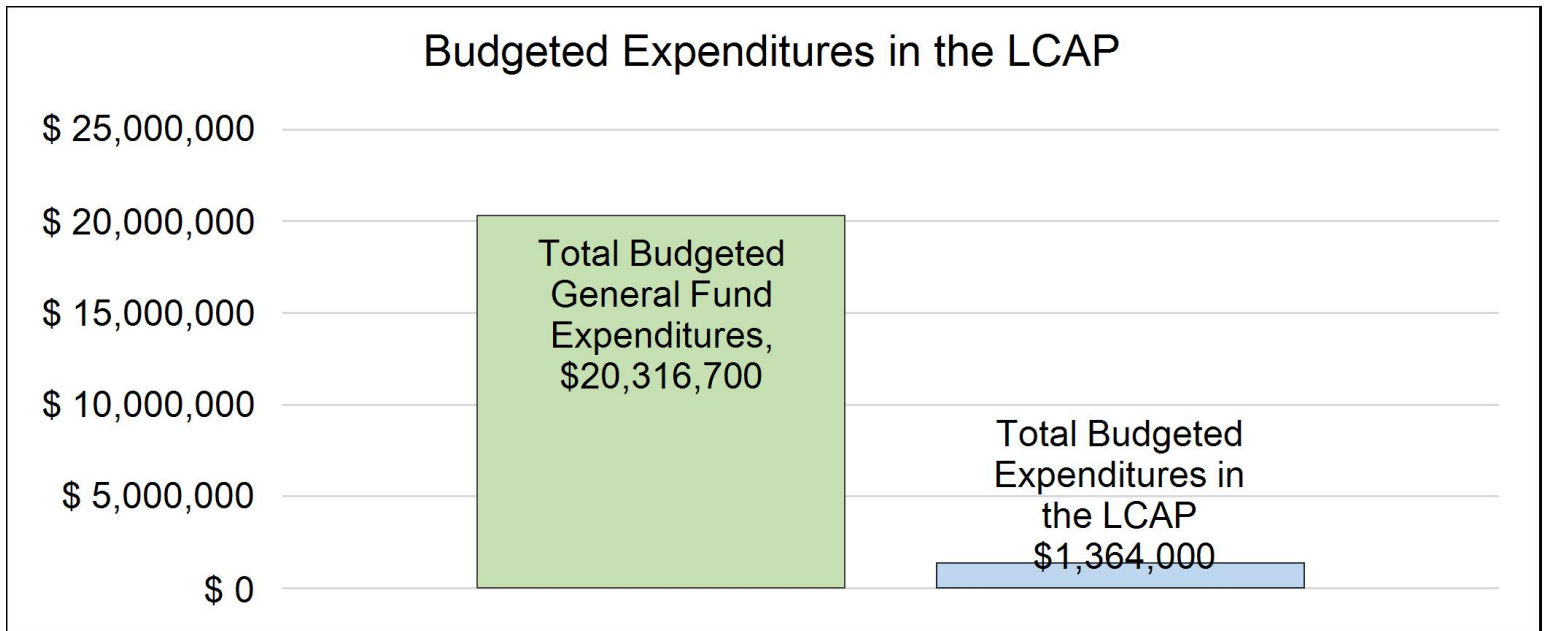
This chart shows the total general purpose revenue Clarksville Charter School expects to receive in the coming year from all sources.

The text description for the above chart is as follows: The total revenue projected for Clarksville Charter School is \$21,869,547, of which \$18,757,802 is Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF), \$2131174 is other state funds, \$ is

local funds, and \$980,571 is federal funds. Of the \$18,757,802 in LCFF Funds, \$1,215,355 is generated based on the enrollment of high needs students (foster youth, English learner, and low-income students).

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The LCFF gives school districts more flexibility in deciding how to use state funds. In exchange, school districts must work with parents, educators, students, and the community to develop a Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) that shows how they will use these funds to serve students.



This chart provides a quick summary of how much Clarksville Charter School plans to spend for 2022-23. It shows how much of the total is tied to planned actions and services in the LCAP.

The text description of the above chart is as follows: Clarksville Charter School plans to spend \$20,316,700 for the 2022-23 school year. Of that amount, \$1,364,000 is tied to actions/services in the LCAP and \$20,316,700 is not included in the LCAP. The budgeted expenditures that are not included in the LCAP will be used for the following:

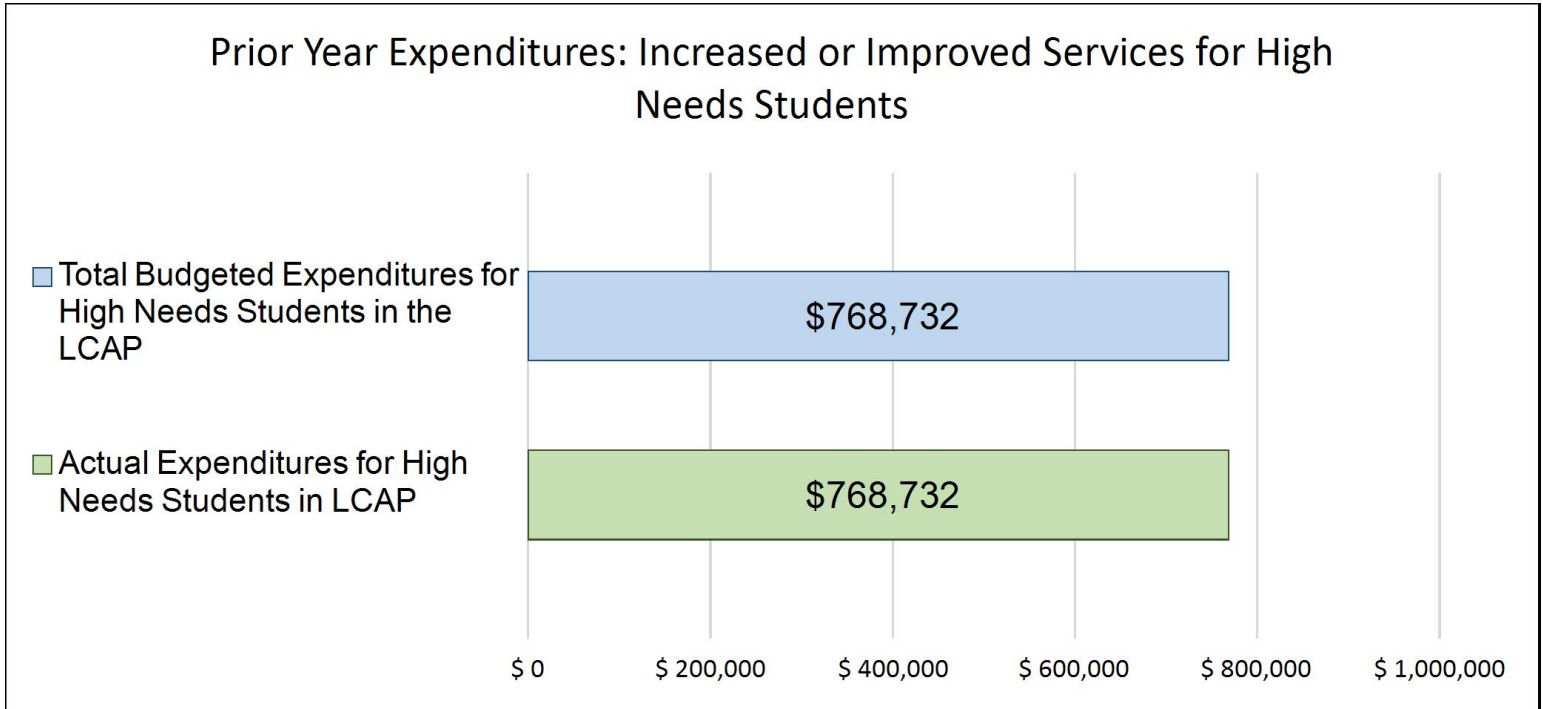
Operational costs and Professional Services rendered to run the school.

Increased or Improved Services for High Needs Students in the LCAP for the 2022-23 School Year

In 2022-23, Clarksville Charter School is projecting it will receive \$1,215,355 based on the enrollment of foster youth, English learner, and low-income students. Clarksville Charter School must describe how it intends to increase or improve services for high needs students in the LCAP. Clarksville Charter School plans to spend \$1,220,000 towards meeting this requirement, as described in the LCAP.
