Computer Contract

Campus Computer Use: Don Bosco Technical Institute (DBTI) is pleased to provide its faculty, staff, and students with computer resources, Internet access, and e-mail services. (DBTI) It also allows students to bring their own personal laptop computers to school for **educational purposes only**. The use of these services at DBTI is a privilege. In accepting this privilege, students commit themselves to these guidelines. By signing this agreement, students agree to follow the school's computer use policy and understand that it is a privilege and failure to abide by the rules in this agreement will result in confiscation of the laptop computer and suspension of the privilege to have a laptop computer on campus. *DBTI and its employees are not responsible for the safety or security of any electronic devices brought to the campus (Parent-Student Handbook).*

1. Computer resources, Internet access, and e-mail services are provided only for educational purposes. This means students may use their laptops for classwork and research for class projects. Failure to abide by these guidelines may result in the suspension of these privileges and/or disciplinary action. Each user is expected to exercise good judgment at all times, abiding by the school's Salesian values and standards.
2. In the use of computer resources, Internet access, and e-mail:
 - a. Do not attempt to or log in as another computer user.
 - b. Do not attempt to or access files that are restricted to the school administration, faculty or staff.
 - c. Do not access, alter or delete computer files that are not your own.
 - d. Do not harm, alter, or destroy the data of another user, computer, the Internet, or any school network that is connected to the Internet. This includes, but is not limited to, the uploading or creation of computer viruses.
 - e. Do not disclose your personal data (address, phone number, etc.) or the personal data of another person (including, but not limited to other students and teachers/staff).
3. When using e-mail services:
 - a. Use appropriate language. Avoid language that is vulgar, impolite, obscene, threatening or slanderous. The transmission or reception of threatening, harassing, obscene, or pornographic material is prohibited.
 - b. E-mail is not guaranteed to be private and may be monitored. DBTI is not responsible for any damages you suffer because of the school's computer resources, Internet access or e-mail services. Use the wireless access and information you obtain from the school's computer resources, Internet access, and email services at your own risk.
