Day 1 Restorative Conflict Intervention

Day 1 will provide participants with a foundational understanding of conflict and the opportunity to develop effective strategies to intervene while also continuing to build trusting relationships.

Topics will include: How to set positive expectations for self and others before conflict occurs, develop skills to intervene restoratively during conflicts, using Restorative Communication, & conducting restorative processes with humility.

Day 2 Restorative Conferencing

Day 2 will provide participants with the foundational knowledge of how to develop & conduct a Restorative Conference for if/when a significant harm within your school community or organization occurs. Participants will learn how to coordinate the pre-conference work and assess for when it is appropriate to move forward with organizing a Restorative Conference.

Participants will learn effective dialogue frameworks, effective seating arrangements, how to develop a restorative plan, & necessary supports for implementing a successful restorative plan.
