BOUNTIFUL JR. HIGH HONORS PROGRAM

Bountiful Junior High offers an outstanding honors program for students with exceptional ability, academic commitment and who desire a more challenging curriculum.

Participation in honors level classes at the junior high level can help students prepare for more rigorous high school courses.

Students enrolled in the honors program will be expected to have advanced reading and writing skills. The classes will move at a rapid pace and many of the assignments will require independent study outside of class.

The 9th grade honors classes offered include:

- Honors English
- Honors Math (must have teacher recommendation)
- AP Environmental Science
- AP Human Geography

AP COURSES

The ultimate goal for students will be to prepare to take and pass the national Advanced Placement (AP) test. These are designed to be college level courses. Pace is fast and extra study will be required to be successful.

College Credit can be earned by taking and passing the AP tests at the end of the year! See your counselor to find out how this applies to college credit and high school graduation requirements.

TESTING

- **ACT** (Jr or Sr) — Entrance test for college. May take more than once. Accepted by all schools. Check college website if writing portion is required. Free ACT administered in February or March of your 11th grade year.
- **RISE** — End of level tests required by the state in core classes.
- **AP/IB Tests** — A series of tests in the subject area for college credit given in May.
- **PSAT** (Soph or Jr) — National Merit test. It allows students to compete in a national scholarship competition. It is usually given in October.
- **SAT I and SAT II** (Jr or Sr) — Achievement tests required by many out-of-state universities and colleges.
- **ASVAB** — Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery. There is no cost for this test.

ACADEMIC CORE MAKE UP CREDIT

Ninth grade students who receive an “F” in English, Math, Science, PE, Exploring Computer Science and/or Geography need to make-up these credits in order to graduate from high school.

Please contact your counselor for credit make-up options. The sooner you have this information the better!

9TH GRADE CITIZENSHIP MAKE-UP

Ninth grade students who have received a “U” in citizenship need to make up the credit in order to graduate from high school. If you received a “U”, please make a “Community Service Contract” (4 hours of community service). Cost is \$5.00 per “U”. See your counselor or Mrs. Schieving (ISS) for ideas and/or information for “U” make-up.

CE vs. AP classes

CE: Concurrent Enrollment



Cost - \$40 registration \$15/class

Enrolled in high school and college class at the same time.

Work hard in class all year as you learn the material.

Grade for class goes on high school AND college transcript.

AP: Advanced Placement



Costs: \$96/test

College-level class. Work hard in class all year as you learn the material. Pay for & take the AP Test.

If you pass the test scoring between a 3 and 5 ...THEN you receive college credit!!

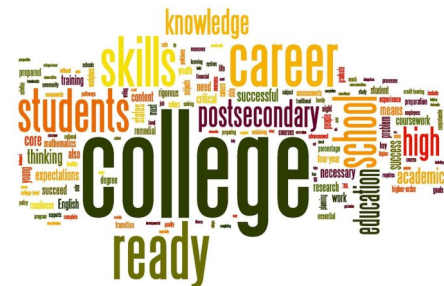

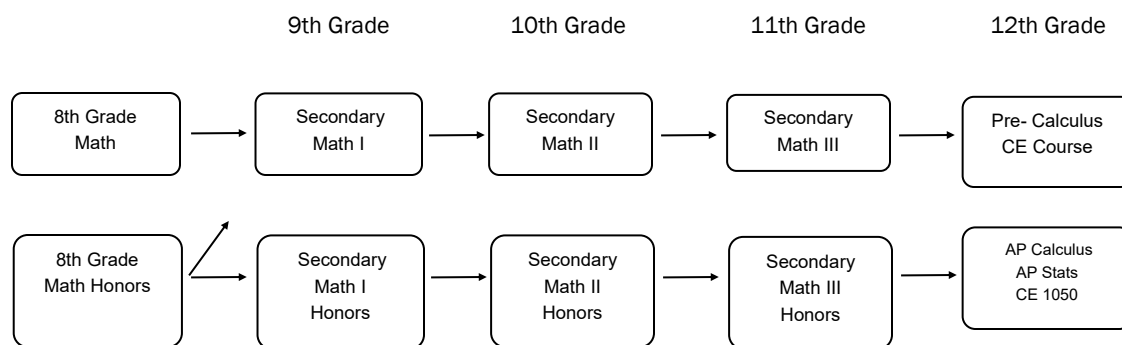

SCHOLARSHIP / FAFSA

Tips for Scholarships

1. Identify & make a list of your strengths.
 2. Focus on scholarships that are a good fit.
 3. Look local.
 4. See what scholarships your top colleges offer.
 5. Start with a web search of your talents.
 6. Create profiles on trustworthy national scholarship search website.
 7. Get organized.
 8. Meet deadlines.
 9. Apply, apply, apply.
- Don't wait until your senior year to look for scholarships, they are available for grades 10-12 all year round!

Scholarships for Utah Residents

- Opportunity Scholarship: An achievement-based scholarship that requires students to complete advanced coursework in high school. Completing a FAFSA is required as part of the application process, but federal aid is not considered when determining eligibility.
- Utah CTE Scholarships: Awards are available to graduating seniors who plan to pursue Career and Technical Education training after high school.
- TH Bell Teaching Incentive Scholarship: Tuition scholarship program that aims to recruit first-generation students into teaching, encourage outstanding students to work in high-need fields.
- Promise Scholarship: a statewide scholarship program available to students with financial need in Utah. It is available at all Utah public colleges, universities, and technical colleges.

General Education Letter of Completion (Weber State)

Students earning the Weber State General Education Letter of Completion, can present it to any State of Utah college or university and have all General Education classes waived at that school. (Basically, this covers the first two years of your college education.

- One AP or CE class must be taken and college credit received for each WSU general education credit in each of 14 categories
- AP Human Geography can be used as both a Diversity credit and one of the two Social Science credits.
- You must score a 3, 4 or 5 on each AP exam to earn college credit
- Students must pass Secondary Math 1, 2, and 3 with a grade of "C" or better to take part in the WSU Letter of Completion
- Students that earn the Letter of Completion will not be eligible for new freshman scholarships

Early College

Students should apply for early college the spring of their junior year. Please contact WSU Early College Office, 801-626-7362 or <http://www.weber.edu/earlycollege/>

Early Graduation:

Earn 27 credits and be eligible for graduation early. Scholarships available for early graduates.
