1. **Choose four score recipients for FREE during registration** - You can make updates to your score recipients for up to nine days after your test date. To make updates, [log in to My SAT on your collegeboard account](#). (sat.collegeboard.org)
2. **Send additional scores:** Four score sends are included free with your registration. If you choose to send more than four, or to send scores outside the registration time period, you will be charged \$12.00 per score send. If you are a fee-waiver-eligible student, you may have additional flexible score report credits. 3. **Score Choice:** gives you the option to choose which scores (by test date for the SAT and by individual test for SAT Subject Tests™) you send to colleges.

<u>ACT Test Date</u>	ACT Scores Posted Online	If your scores are not available on that first date, check back weekly. Scores are processed and added each week, usually each Wednesday and Friday. Normally, all scores are reported by 8 weeks after the test date. If you took the ACT Plus Writing , your Writing scores will be posted online as soon as they are ready, normally about 2 weeks after your

- 1. Choose four score recipients for FREE during registration** - The deadline for adding, changing, or canceling college reports is the Thursday noon (central time) immediately after the regularly scheduled Saturday test date.
- 2. Send additional scores** - You can have your ACT scores sent to other colleges and scholarship agencies after you test in addition to the ones you selected when you registered or tested. Requests are processed **AFTER** your tests have been scored and all scores for your test option—ACT (No Writing) or ACT Plus Writing—are ready. There is a \$13 fee for each additional score report sent.
- 3. ACT reports ONLY the scores from the test date you designate**, not any other test scores. This ensures that you direct the reporting of your scores.

- SAT includes one SAT Math Section on which you may not use a calculator
