Direct Service	 A certified teacher of the Blind and Visually Impaired can provide direct itinerant services to a child in his/her home school or educational placement, including. Instruction in the reading and writing of the Unified English Braille code Integration of Unified English Braille into the curriculum Instruction in high and low technology options for print materials used by low vision students Instruction in the use of adapted materials for tactile or visual learners Instruction in the Expanded Core Curriculum for the Visually Impaired in the areas of Independent Living, Recreation and Leisure, Self-Determination skills, Transition to Adult Life, Social Interaction, Technology, Visual Efficiency, and Use of Compensatory Skills due to limited vision Instruction with recommended technology and/or adapted software Pre-teaching for concept development in curriculum areas Ongoing Learning Media Assessment
