






Indoors

Dave & Busters is a really fun Arcade with tons of fun games that you can play, for example, Minecraft Dungeons/Arcade Edition, Luigi's Mansion/Arcade Edition, and Skee Ball. Some games though are for older kids like 12+ or something, so remember to check before you play. They're not just good with the games, they have really good burgers and fries for you to take a break and eat. People under 18 years old must be accompanied by an adult age 25+ with a max of 6 people per adult. Every game can be played by using a card with a bunch of chips on it (purchased at the front desk). Every game costs around 6ish chips each.

Dance, Dance, Dance!!! (VICTORIA)


I loved the Middle School Dance. It was sooo fun!
