POLICY TOPIC DESCRIPTION

Chorus

Purpose:

To provide an opportunity for interested students to perform vocal music beyond the level of the general music class. To learn correct vocal performance skills as a part of a performance group.

Entry Requirements:

- 4th or 5th grade student
- Interest in singing.
- Tone matching- the ability to sing a simple familiar melody in an appropriate range. Determined through auditions.

Expectations:

Student:

- Appropriate effort and willingness during rehearsals to learn correct vocal performance skills and musical selections.
- Attendance at all rehearsals with the exception of absences from school. A maximum of two (2) rehearsals, other than absences from school, are allowed before dismissal from Chorus.
- Appropriate behavior, based on school rules and expectations, during all rehearsals and performances. First violation will result in a warning. Second violation will result in referral to the school administration, and possible dismissal from chorus

Parent:

- Provide requested Chorus outfit.
- Support for the student to be in attendance at Chorus rehearsals and programs.

Club Policy

Purpose:

To provide an opportunity for interested students to increase their skills through projects, activities, performances, and technology.

Entry Requirements:

- 4th or 5th grade student at Burlington Elementary School
- Interest in topic (i.e. math, science, drama)
- Club sponsor reserves the right to limit the number of participants based on space and activities

Expectations:

Student:

- Willingness to participate in group and individual Club activities and projects.
- Attendance at all Club sessions with the exception of absences from school. A maximum of two unexcused absences are allowed before dismissal from the club.
- Appropriate behavior, based on school rules and expectations, is expected at all Club sessions. First violation will result in a warning. Second violation will result in a referral to school administration and possible dismissal from the Club

Parent:

- Make sure the student is picked up/dropped off at the appropriate time.

Student Technology Leadership Program (STLP) Policy

Purpose:

To provide an opportunity for students with an interest in computers and technology to learn and apply new computer skills.

To provide an opportunity for students to assist other students, faculty and staff, and/or the school community through the use of technology.

Entry Requirements:

- Students all grade levels that attend Burlington Elementary.
- Interest in computers.
- Must be willing to stay before or after school as needed.

Expectations:

Student:

- Appropriate effort and willingness to learn and apply new technology skills, and to use learned skills to better the school environment, instruction, and community
- Attendance at trainings is expected. Every effort will be made to provide at least 2 training sessions.
- Appropriate behavior, based on school rules and expectations, is expected at all STLP functions and/or trainings. First violation will result in a warning. Second violation will result in a referral to school administration and possible dismissal from STLP.

Parent:

- Provide before or after school transportation as needed.

Cheerleading Policy

Purpose:

To provide an equal opportunity for students to participate in an organized cheerleading program. This program will be structured to teach fundamental skills of cheerleading in a non-pressured environment, and to provide positive examples of sportsmanship, teamwork, and leadership skills.

Entry Requirements:

- Be a 4th or 5th grade student at Burlington Elementary
- Pay the activity fee required prior to participation (unless otherwise arranged with coordinator and school)
- Interest in cheerleading, regardless of ability level

Expectations:

Student:

- Expected to be at all practices and games, unless an excuse note is received prior to activity. Unexcused absences from practice will result in having to sit out the upcoming game. 2 unexcused absences will result in dismissal from squad.
- Represent Burlington Elementary in a positive manner.
- Demonstrate appropriate behavior based on school rules and expectations, as well as good sportsmanship. Violations will result in sitting out part of game, all of game, referral to administrator for disciplinary action, or dismissal from squad.

Parent:

- Pay a deposit fee, prior to participating, that will be returned when uniform (including skirt and top) and pompoms are returned to the program coordinator.
- Sign out child promptly after practice.
- Provide, or make other arrangements for, transportation of child to and from games (at the appropriate times).
- Purchase white ankle socks, a white long-sleeved turtleneck shirt, royal blue cheer briefs, and white tennis shoes (may use any of these items if already have them).

Intramural Basketball Policy

Purpose:

To provide every 4th and 5th grade boy/girl an opportunity to learn the fundamentals of basketball on an organized team in a non-pressure environment. This program is to be instructional in nature and stress skill development, value of teamwork, and teach healthy values towards competition.

Entry Requirements:

- Pay participation fee which includes their uniform t-shirt.
- Provided for students in 4th and 5th grades at Burlington Elementary School
- Students, at all ability levels, interested in playing basketball.

Expectations:

Student:

- To demonstrate willingness to listen to coaches and referees, accept constructive criticism, and give best effort to learn the skills and concepts related to basketball.
- To display appropriate behavior, based on school rules and expectations, during all practices and games. First violation will result in a warning. Second violation will result in 1 game suspension (player is still expected to attend game). Third violation may result in dismissal from team.
- To attend all practices and games promptly. 2 or more unexcused absences will result in loss of playing time and possible dismissal from team (at coach and coordinator's discretion)
- To represent Burlington Elementary in a positive manner.

Parent:

- To follow all universal requirements for student eligibility in the areas of student enrollment, school attendance, completion of homework, and student behavior/conduct.
- To arrange for student to arrive at and be picked up from practice and games on time.

Academic Team Policy

Purpose:

To provide an opportunity for students who are chosen for the team to compete against other schools in quick recall competitions and other knowledge-based events.

Entry Requirements:

- 4th or 5th grade student at Burlington Elementary School
- Strong knowledge of one or more subjects
- Ability to respond quickly and correctly to knowledge based questions
- Must demonstrate abilities through tryout.

Expectations:

Student:

- Appropriate effort and willingness to participate at weekly practices and scheduled competitions.
- Willingness to study subject matter and knowledge based questions in preparation for competitions.
- Attendance at all practices and competitions with the exception of absences from school. All absences, other than absences from school, must be confirmed with the coach prior to the practice or match. A maximum of 2 absences are allowed before dismissal from the Academic Team.
- Appropriate behavior based on school rules and expectations at practices and competitions. Academic team members should demonstrate leadership, sportsmanship, respect and responsibility. First violation will result in a warning. Second violation will result in a referral to school administration and possible dismissal from the team.

Parent:

- Provide before or after school transportation as needed.
