Hinsdale Central High School is located 17 miles west of Chicago in DuPage County and serves a suburban residential area. Students live in the communities of Hinsdale, Burr Ridge, Clarendon Hills, Darien, Oak Brook, Westmont, and Willowbrook.

School

Hinsdale Central is one of two comprehensive high schools in Hinsdale Township School District 86. Fall 2022 enrollment at Central is approximately 2560 students with 667 seniors in the Class of 2022. More than 99% of Central's students' complete high school with 84.1% of the Class of 2021 pursuing a four-year college education, 9.2% choosing two-year colleges, 2.6 % attending our transition programs and 4.1% pursuing other opportunities/undecided at the time of graduation. Hinsdale Central is a member of the North Central Association, The College Board, and NACAC/IACAC. The district per pupil operating cost is approximately \$22,283.

Organization of School Year

The school year consists of two semesters. The day is divided into seven 50 - minute periods. The first semester ends on January 14, 2022 and the second semester ends on June 2, 2022.

Faculty Stats

Of the 216 certified faculty members, 202 hold a Masters Degree and 3 hold Doctorates degrees. 35% percent of the faculty has 20 or more years of experience in education. 16 teachers are Nationally Board Certified.

Student Services

A comprehensive program of student services is provided. Twelve counseling professionals assist students with personal, social and academic concerns, college selection, and career/vocational plans. Complementing the counselors are social workers, school psychologists, deans, nurses and a fully inclusive Special Education program.

There are 31 athletic teams and over 85 clubs available to students. Hinsdale Central athletes have captured over 100 state championships, the second most among high schools in the state. In 2014-2015, Hinsdale Central broke the IHSA State Record for the most State Championships in one year, capturing 10 State Championships in athletics and activities combined. More than 90% of the student body participates in at least one of the 85+ active clubs and organizations. Our athletic and activity programs are considered an extension of our classrooms; we strive to teach lifelong lessons as well as sportsmanship, leadership and character. Hinsdale Central was recognized in 2007 as a State School of Character and in 2008 as a State and National School of Character and in 2017 as a School of Excellence for student athletics.
