1. Please read pages 4 - 98 (Periods I & II : 1491 - 1754) from the textbook and take notes in preparation for an open note assessment on 9/8. You may type or write your notes. There is no specific manner in which I expect the notes to be presented - how you take notes is your personal choice. There is no maximum or minimum that I am looking for in regards to bullets or pages. The only specifics that I will be looking for can be found in the bulleted list below.

To better situate yourself for the assessment, cater your notes toward the following:

- *Causes and effects* of major events throughout period
- *Key individuals and their significant historical impact* on the period
- *Continuities and changes* during the period (social, political, religious, economic)
- *Comparison* between the Northern and Southern colonies during the period

- Use your notes (written or printed...no ipad/phone/laptop) during your first assessment on **Friday 9/9**. The assessment will be equipped with 25 multiple choice questions (MCQs) as well as 2 short answers (SAQs) and will be worth 100 points.
