## Accountability improvement plans developing

Although CISD received a B on the state's accountability rating, CMS and ACW have been targeted for support. The first step in that process has been the hiring of a District Coordinator of School Improvement, which was accomplished last month. Hannah Farrell has begun attending training sessions, along with Assistant Superintendent Dr. Patricia Tremmel and Principals Tina Bronson and Lisa Palazzetti, to begin analyzing the data to learn which deficiencies exist and develop ways to address them.

Cari Sturch will aid in this effort at CES and Sheila DeMidio will return to CISD as a coordinator at ACW.

Director of Finance John Walker led the annual review of investment policy and investment strategies explaining there has been no change in regulations since 2017. He explained policies were set to ensure the safety of the principal.

Director of Health Services Kathy Myers nominated the following staff and parents for the School Health Advisory Council: Alison Walker, Joe Venable, Patricia Tremmel, Anna Black, Vanessa Clark, Shannon Shannon, Sarah Staton, Shanda Harris, Lisa Gossett and Tiffany Storm. The committee was approved as presented.

The Board approved the hiring of Chris Vet, social studies teacher at CHS.

Enrollment was up 15 students from this time last year.
