4 Graduation Rates and Career Competencies

Interviews and observations indicate welding instruction by a career and technical education teacher, completing career assessment, studying for SAT, and working on assignments in small groups. Site coordinator shared student and staff data collection procedures and plans for increasing career and technical education opportunities that align with student interests. Students have continued to work on objectives that do not require face-to-face instruction including safety and certification test preparation during remote instruction.
