
STUDENTS – NON-PUBLIC STUDENT PARTICIPATION IN PUBLIC SCHOOL

Students residing in Washington Township, Hamilton County, Indiana between the minimum and maximum ages established by state law for school attendance who attend private or parochial schools or who are home schooled may enroll and attend a class on an abbreviated schedule in Westfield Washington Schools (WWS) provided that:

- courses taken are not offered at the student's current school;
- any prerequisites to courses have been satisfied;
- student is placed within their chronological age group;
- space is available within the requested class; and
- students in grades 9-12 are enrolled and on a diploma track.

Students who participate in the curricular program in WWS will be counted as enrolled students in the ADM. Students who are counted as enrolled must participate in the required state and local testing programs.

Home schooled, private, or parochial school students who wish to participate in extra-curricular sports or activities must be enrolled full-time in WWS in order to be eligible to participate. Students enrolled in curricular classes may participate in after school curricular activities if participation is a requirement for the class. Students may be transported to and from school by WWS provided that such transportation is part of an existing route.

Home schooled, private, or parochial school students who enroll in WWS on a full-time or abbreviated schedule will be placed in a grade level or schedule based primarily upon chronological age. If testing or screening is required, the principal will have the authority to reassign the student according to age, progress, and other important variables. The testing/screening may involve a review of the student's home education plan, a list of all persons who conducted the home instruction program, an outline of the curriculum which was followed, and a list of all instructional materials used.
