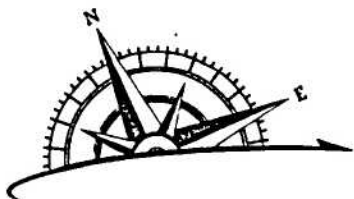

The Department of Teaching and Learning seeks to secure the services of Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. in the 2019-2020 school year to provide continued expertise and support to address the deficiencies identified in the letter of findings related to the systemic complaint filed with the Virginia Department of Education (VDOE).

The expertise and support from Enseñar Educational Services, Inc., particularly from Robert H. Pasternack, Ph.D., will be used to assist in training psychologists on evaluation practices; developing a policies and procedures manual related to evaluation and reevaluation; building capacity of staff on facilitating IEPs; identifying strategic actions to improve outcomes of students with disabilities as mentioned in the VDOE letter of findings related to the systemic complaint; working with the Special Education Advisory Committee to execute the special education plan; planning for parent training opportunities; and working with school leadership to reduce discipline and suspensions of students with disabilities in the division.

Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. is the only company in the United States serving Local Education Agencies (LEAs) and State Education Agencies (SEAs) led exclusively by Dr. Robert Pasternack. Dr. Pasternack's expertise in the area of critical need (special education) for our school division comes as a result of his having served as Assistant Secretary for the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services (OSERS) at the U.S. Department of Education. Serving in that capacity, he was directly responsible for the reauthorization of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) and the implementation of No Child Left Behind which provides the foundation for special education law. He also served previously as a State Director of Special Education and Superintendent. Dr. Pasternack is a nationally certified school psychologist, a certified educational diagnostician, a certified school administrator, and a certified teacher (K-12).

Enseñar Educational Services' uniquely qualified team works with the learning community, education leaders, and

families of students with disabilities to improve outcomes while also working to reduce inappropriate referrals to special education through the implementation of an intervention framework. Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. is also the only company in the United States serving school communities with a team member who was the former Director of the National Center on Special Education Accountability and Monitoring (NCSEAM).

The Department of Teaching and Learning evaluated the services offered and determined that the knowledge, experience, and expertise of the team members of Enseñar Educational Services, Inc., especially those of Dr. Pasternack, would be invaluable in meeting our needs to support and improve services for students with disabilities. We have found no other source with this vendor's level of expertise that is practically available during the timeframe with which we need to address our special education needs and deficiencies as outlined in our letter of findings.

The costs associated with the specialized, customized nature of services we are requesting from Enseñar Educational Services, Inc. is fair, reasonable, and commensurate with other educational service providers.

The impact of not having immediate access to this locally-based, customized resource will potentially delay the implementation of structured supports to improve outcomes for students with disabilities and effective, efficient implementation of time-sensitive action steps that address deficiencies that are outlined in the letter of findings from the VDOE.
