
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NORTHWEST LOCAL RATED EXCELLENT WITH DISTINCTION

After three years of being rated "Excellent" by the Ohio Department of Education, the Northwest Local School

District has achieved the highest possible rating of "Excellent with Distinction." The overall rating is determined by evaluations in four general areas: the percentage of state indicators met, Performance Index Score, Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) results and Value-Added rating. Northwest Local met 100 percent of the 26 state indicators that cover testing, attendance and graduation rates and



earned a Performance Indicator of 102.5. Of the 610 school districts in the State of Ohio, only 138 earned an "Excellent with Distinction" rating. Northwest Local is proud to be a part of this elite group.

Dr. Mike Shreffler expressed his appreciation of the team effort: "The rating of 'Excellent with Distinction' is a reflection of the collective effort and hard work of our students, staff and supportive community. The board of education, administration, teachers, paraprofessional staff, students and community have worked together to make this achievement possible. Everyone has worked to support

the goals of our strategic plan, and this rating indicates our commitment to the children of this school district."

In May 2010 the Northwest Local District promised voters a quality academic program and fiscal responsibility. For the 2011-2012 school year, Northwest's per pupil expenditure was \$7959.14, while the state average annual expenditure per pupil was \$10,696. Race to the Top Update

Northwest Local is currently focusing on the work outlined in year three of its Race to the Top Grant. The district has formed a Student Learning Objectives (SLO) Committee that will focus on developing a district plan for assisting teachers in developing student growth measures. The growth measures will be utilized to monitor the academic progress of our students and the data gathered from the SLO's will be used as part of the teacher evaluation system.

The district continues to focus on implementing the Formative Instructional Practices (FIP) initiative, which identifies clear learning targets for each content area, and developing and deploying common assessment practices. The district is piloting Ohio's teacher and principal evaluation systems with a focus on full implementation during the upcoming school year.

The Race to the Top transformation team met Friday, December 7, to monitor the district's progress in meeting identified goals and performance measures, determined the percentage of value-added growth measures that will be used at each grade level, and focused on the district's implementation procedures for the new teacher and principal evaluation systems.

The district is currently on track to meet its identified Race to the Top goals and performance measures.


Third Grade Guarantee

Recent legislation by the Ohio Legislature strengthened the longstanding Third-Grade Guarantee, once called the Fourth-Grade Guarantee, to give a greater emphasis to reading instruction and intervention in the early grades. Through this initiative, school districts and community schools will diagnose reading deficiencies in students at grades kindergarten through three, create individualized reading improvement and monitoring plans and provide intensive reading interventions.

Each year during the month of September, all students in kindergarten through third grade shall be assessed using an English Language Arts diagnostic assessment. Student are on-track if they are reading at grade-level based on the previous end-of-year standards' expectations by September 30. Students identified as not on-track are not reading at grade level, based on previous end-of-year standards' expectations by September 30.

For the 2012-2013 school year, students must score 390 on either the fall or spring administration of the third grade reading Ohio Achievement Assessment (OAA). The district must select one of the following options for students not reaching the designated score on the third grade reading OAA:

• Promote the student to the fourth grade if the principal and student's reading teacher agree that the student is prepared academically for Grade 4,

based on another evaluation of reading skill;

- Promote the student to the fourth grade, but continue to provide intensive intervention services in Grade 4; or
- Retain the student in the third grade.

Parents who have questions about the guarantee should contact their child's building principal or Director of Instruction Debora Clark.





Mr. Travis Stroh's class won the middle school's canned food drive by collecting 300 items. The middle school donated 13 hundred cans to the local community cupboard.




Seventh-Grade Greek Mythological Olympics

Santa Arrives Early at Northwest Bus Garage

Who doesn't love a bargain? Northwest Transportation Director Ray Gesaman never expected to locate a great buy on a school bus on Craigslist. "I was on there looking at vehicles and noticed this ad that said, 'School Bus - \$35,000 Parma.' The bus was listed as 'a 2009 model, Mercedes Benz engine, 54 passengers.' In the photo the bus looked new," said Gesaman.

Gesaman found that the bus, purchased by a private Christian school in Parma for 70 thousand dollars, had decided to sell the vehicle for financial reasons. The bus had been built to Ohio school bus specifications, had passed state inspections in August 2012, and had logged fewer than 26 thousand miles. After a test drive, mechanical inspection and discussion with other school districts who owned similar buses, Gesaman and District Treasurer Dan Levengood finalized the deal November 1.

Northwest Local Schools Committed to Stop Bullying

The district took an important step in the implementation of the research-based Olweus Bullying Prevention Program Nov. 5 with a staff training. All staff members, including bus drivers, secretaries, custodians, aides, tutors and teachers, were given an overview of the program and training that explained the potential for bullying in the classroom, school and community with an emphasis on promoting communication with parents.

Students in grades 4-8 and a sample of students in grades 9-12 took part in an Olweus Bullying Prevention questionnaire. This questionnaire provided information as to the "hot spots," places where students report bullying taking place most often, are in each building so supervision can be increased. The questionnaire also gives data that can be used as a baseline for future questionnaires as a way of measuring program success.

During the week of January 22, each

building will kick off their bullying prevention program with a theme of "Count on Me."
