
Lindic Finishes Second at State Meet; Peters Takes Seventh






Miss Northwest & Mr. Northwest Named for 2011


Middle School Principal Jay Baughman to Pursue New Career

Middle School Principal Jay Baughman, an 18-year veteran of Northwest Local Schools, will be leaving the district to join the First Baptist Church of Jackson as a High School Youth Pastor. Baughman completed First Baptist's Bible Institute five years ago simply to learn more about the Bible and "to be able to better serve the Lord Jesus Christ." The experience has led to his decision "to move from Principal to Pastor," as Baughman explains, "God has blessed me in every place He has directed my family and me."

Baughman says he has enjoyed his work here: "I am truly going to miss the great relationships with students, parents, and staff and being here day to day with everybody. But, I hope to still have a close connection to the Northwest community, just in a different and amazing new capacity!"

Bob Venables, currently the assistant principal at the high school, will return to the middle school to replace Baughman. Venables will do an excellent job in his return because of his relationships with the staff and students as well as knowledge of the building which is being remodeled.

High School Roof Being Repaired this Summer will involve repairing



One facet of the facilities project this summer will involve repairing leaks in the high school roof. Braun & Steidl Architects, Inc., and RoofTEC, the district's roof consultant, will repair the steep slope, shingled areas of the high school.

The board of education, in conjunction with legal counsel, is moving to recover the repair costs of the leaky roof at the high school from the responsible parties. Board members are unable to comment on the details of that process because it involves possible legal action.

Superintendent Bill Stetler explains, "These repairs are absolutely necessary. The district wants to assure the community that we are doing our best to hold the responsible parties accountable."

The repair work is the final step in the process begun by Braun & Steidl Architects, Inc., and RoofTEC to plan a fix and to develop a conceptual design and budget.
