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Northwest Technology Prepares Students for Future Success

When school opens Monday, August 19, students will see a continued emphasis on technology, which has changed the way our schools operate. Technology allows us to provide better communication with parents, more accessible learning for students and an enhanced educational environment.



Northwest Local Implements ProgressBook

Thirty years ago parents waited for a quarterly report card to find out how a child was doing in the classroom. By the time parents found out that a child was struggling in a class, it was often too late to take steps to raise the grade. Today, thanks to the electronic gradebook, parents have continuous access to see their children's performance. Parents and teachers can work together to make certain the student is completing assignments, grasping concepts and experiencing success.

This year Northwest will implement ProgressBook, an online grade book program. ProgressBook will replace Pinnacle, which was previously used by the district. ProgressBook has a Parent Access portal that enables parents and students to have 24/7 access to see their grades online, including a management tool that enables parents to use one set of login credentials to view the progress of all of their children. The district will send home Parent Access portal directions and login credentials by September 15 for students whose fees are paid.

Students in grades three through twelve will continue to receive a traditional report card each nine weeks for the 2013-2014 school year. Students in kindergarten through second grade will receive a standards-based report card each nine weeks. A standards-based report card demonstrates the student's progress in mastering the academic content standards adopted for their grade level. In other words, parents will understand how their children are doing in specific areas of a subject rather than the subject as a whole. This will help staff partner with parents to reinforce skills that a child does well in and work to improve those skills that require attention. Additional information regarding standards-based grading and the report card will be provided utilizing parent meetings, parent-teacher conferences and the district's website.

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Casino Revenues: The Impact on Our District Dan Levensgood, Treasurer

The Ohio Department of Taxation recently released the news that schools will be sharing an estimated \$45.4 million payment from casino revenues at the end of August. The payment is the second and last payment that Ohio schools will receive this calendar year. Northwest Local will receive approximately \$52,000 of this \$45.4 million to support the education of our students.

Ohio voters authorized construction of one casino in each of Ohio's four largest cities in 2009. The first Ohio casinos opened in May 2012 in Cleveland and Toledo, followed by the opening of the Columbus facility in October. Operations began at the Cincinnati location in March of this year. Just over a third (34%) of all taxed casino revenue is to flow to Ohio's school districts, according to the voter approved constitutional amendment. These funds flow to Ohio's schools on a per-pupil basis. Based on a statewide estimated pupil enrollment of 1.75 million students, the distribution of \$45.4 million equates to \$25.94 per student for each school. Based on our current enrollment of 2,010 students, our portion of the distribution is approximately \$52,000.00.

The headline from the Ohio Department of Taxation news release is impressive, and we greatly appreciate this additional sum. However, it's important to consider that after you get past the headline from the press release, the actual amount that Northwest Local will receive equates to less than 1% of our general operating fund budget.

Local State Report Card

Every year we share with you the rating assigned to our school district by the state of Ohio. Last year we received the ranking of “Excellent with Distinction.” This year the state is changing the way it measures and rates the performance of schools and districts. In August 2013 the report card will have nine measures that receive letter grades, but no component or overall grades will be assigned until August 2015. The nine measures are categorized into four major areas:

Achievement

- Performance Index – measures the test results of every student
- Performance Indicators Met – shows the percentage of students who passed the state tests at a minimum level, which is designated as “proficient,” or higher

Progress

- Overall – the district’s average progress for students in reading and math, grades 4-8
- Gifted Students – the average progress for students who are identified as gifted
- Students in the lowest 20% of achievement
- Students with disabilities – the average progress for students who are identified as having a learning disability

Graduation Rates

- 4-Year Graduation Rate – students who graduate within four years of enrolling in high school
- 5-Year Graduation Rate – students who graduate within five years of enrolling in high school

Gap Closing

- Annual Measurable Objectives – compares the performance of all students to state goals in the areas of reading, mathematics, and graduation.

The district’s 2012-2013 report card data will be released in early September and will be included in the October *Northwest News*.

Race to the Top Update

The district has successfully completed the year three activities that were part of its Race to the Top (RtT) Grant. During the 2013-2014 school year the focus will include:

- Implementation of the Ohio Teacher Evaluation Systems (OTES),
- Roll out of the Common Core Reading and Math Standards and new state Science and Social Studies Standards,
- Utilization of common assessments, and
- Preparation for the new state assessment implementation during the 2014-2105 school year. The final year of the district’s RtT Professional Development Plan focuses on training staff members to develop common assessments and utilize the data to meet the learning needs of each student in the district.

District Focus on Reading

During the upcoming school year the English Language Arts (ELA) committee will be evaluating K-12 reading materials with the intent of selecting new materials that align with the Common Core Reading Standards. These standards provide a consistent, clear standard of what students are expected to learn so teachers and parents can help them effectively. A select group of ELA teachers will pilot these materials in their classrooms and provide input to the committee during the selection process. The new materials will be purchased and implemented district-wide during the 2014-2015 school year.

Also, the district will implement the STARS Early Literacy and Reading assessment tool. We are excited by this tool because all K-12 students in the district will be screened three times during the school year to determine their current reading level, areas of strength, and areas of need. The data gathered from the screenings will then be utilized to provide meaningful individualized instruction for each student. Students identified as being in need of urgent intervention will be provided with intensive reading support through various options including small group instruction, tutoring during the school day and/or after school, summer school opportunities, and frequent monitoring of their progress.

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Northwest Technology Prepares Students for the 21st Century

As a result of the implementation of the HB 264 project in 2011 and the renovation projects at the middle school, high school and Stinson Elementary, the district has acquired technology that will enhance student learning. From power-sipping thin client computers to interactive projectors and document cameras, these advancements will help to provide students with the knowledge and skills to succeed in tomorrow's world in addition to reducing the district's utility expenses.

So what's new at Northwest?



BrightLink Projectors

- Interactive SMART Board and projector all-in-one
- Lamp can be centrally managed (power savings)
- Wireless compatibility with tablets and iPads



Document Cameras

- Replaces overhead projectors of yester-year with energy efficient bulbs
- Projects actual image of whatever is being viewed



Security Cameras/Access Control

- All school buildings now have cameras that record events, providing additional safety in an already well-secured environment
- All school buildings now are electronically locked with the ability to allow approved visitors to be "buzzed in"

Video Distribution System

- Provides a means for distributing a wide variety of video content to classrooms, providing opportunities to deliver lessons and programs to many rooms at once rather than gathering in one area
- Provides access for staff development from the desktop

Occupancy Sensors

- Turns off lights when a room is vacant
- Automatically turns lights on when a room becomes populated
- Balances natural light with efficient florescent fixtures for maximum efficiency

- Provides a central means to amplify computer, DVD/ VHS and TV output
- One teacher and one student microphone in each classroom ensure clear communication
- Auditorium/Gymnasium/Conference Room Audio Visual Systems
- Provides the latest program presentation opportunities



Thin Client Computing

- Centralized computing via a “cloud” in the Northwest data network
- Consumption of 1/8 of the power of a small PC
- No moving parts = less repair
- LCD monitors consume 1/4 of the power of the CRT monitors they replaced
- Secure, climate controlled equipment rooms will aid extending the life of data equipment
- Students now have a file folder on a dedicated server to eliminate the need for individual means of storage like a flash drive

All Northwest H.S. Students will take Online Class

Northwest High School has expanded its E-Learning opportunities, and this year students will be required to take health class online. The class will be administered through PLATO, a platform which provides a strong curriculum as well as 24/7 access to the coursework. Students taking the class will be assigned to the computer lab which will be supervised by the E-learning coordinator.

Like many other Stark County school districts, Northwest recognizes the need for students to have an online experience prior to graduation. In fact, while many states have already required that students take an online class, Ohio is also moving in that direction.

Intervention Time to Meet Individual Needs

Starting this year each student will begin their day with 30 minutes of intervention. Prior to leaving for the summer, each teacher identified a specific area of need for every student at the middle school this coming year. The fifth, sixth, and seventh grade teachers met as grade levels and determined the greatest need for each student. For example, a student might be seen as needing intervention in reading comprehension, math problem-solving, or organizational skills. Every professional in the building will take one of these areas of intervention and work with a small group of students for 9, 18, 27, or 36 weeks, depending upon student needs. Students who do not need intervention will be receiving enrichment during this time. Finally, we will monitor the progress of each student to see if the intervention program is effective.

The pay-to-participate fee has been eliminated for the 2013-2014 school year. An activity fee for all students will be implemented in its place.
