Sex Education in Texas

What does State Law say?

Texas law requires school districts to follow a specific process when adopting curriculum for sex education, as well as instruction for prevention of child abuse, dating or family violence, and sex trafficking. Many of these steps changed in the 2021 legislative session.

How the process works

- 1.) The school board adopts a formal resolution noting the process that the district will use to adopt instructional materials for sex education or prevention of child abuse, dating or family violence, and sex trafficking.
- 2.) The school board issues a resolution directing the SHAC to review curriculum and make a recommendation.
- 3.) The SHAC reviews curriculum and holds at least **2 public meetings** before selecting their recommendation.
- 4.) The SHAC presents the curriculum recommendation to the school board.
- 5.) The school board adopts the curriculum through a record vote at a public meeting.
- 6.) Before campuses provide the new curriculum, they must send extensive notices to parents/guardians describing the content that will be taught. **Parents/guardians must provide consent to opt their children into this instruction.**

What is the board's role?

The elected school board trustees are responsible for starting the process by issuing a resolution directing the SHAC to review curriculum and make a recommendation. They will also vote to adopt a curriculum.

What is the SHAC's role?

- Each Texas school district is required by State law to have School Health Advisory Council (SHAC).
- A SHAC is made up of parents, community volunteers, as well as district staff, appointed by the school board.
- SHAC's are charged with ensuring that local values are reflected into health education.
- The SHAC reviews curriculum for sex education or prevention of child abuse, dating or family violence, and sex trafficking, and makes a recommendation to the school board.

Instructional Materials Adoption

The Texas State Board of Education approved the following curriculum for school districts to utilize:

- **Goodheart-Willcox** (Grades 6, 7 & 8, Health 1 & 2)
 - Meets 100% of TEKS. Approved after removal of significant instructional content on condoms and HIV prevention medication.
