SEC RED CHAMPIONS SEASON RECORD 19-3

The DHS Womens Varsity Basketball team had a stellar season this year, ending their first regular season in the SEC Red with a record of 14-0. In addition to beating rival Chelsea, the team also beat West Bloomfield (the 2022 D1 State Championship team's only loss). Dexter's hardworking team entered the post-season ranked 7th in the D1 Michigan State Power Rankings, ending their season in the District finals with a season record of 19-3.

The team earned Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (BCAM) Team Academic All-State, and senior **Sydney Pnacek** set a program record of 7 games with over 20 points.

The entire varsity team attended the first-ever SEC Women's in Leadership Conference along with all other varsity teams in the SEC. This conference was organized and run by Lauren Thompson (Dexter Head Coach), Leigh Roehm (Saline Head Coach), and Eve Claar (Pioneer Athletic Director). The Keynote speaker was Kim Barnes Arico (U-M Womens Basketball Coach).



ens Swim & Dive finished in 5th place in their first season in the SEC Red. Senior Diver **Cole Warren** set varsity and pool records for 6 dives and finished 2nd at the 2022 D2 MHSAA State Finals.

Eight team members made the cut for the MHSAA D2 State Finals. The 200 Medley Relay team of **Lucas Greatorex**, **Adan Hauser**, **Stuart Bovich** and **Matthew Resende** finished 16th. Hauser finished in 17th place finish in the 500 free and 25th in the 200 IM. He was also part of the 400 free relay team that finished 21st along with **Tristan Lorincz**, Resende, and Greatorex.

Greatorex earned a 26th place finish in the 50 free and 27th in the 100 back, while Resende was 25th in the 100 fly **Jack Haidl** was 23rd and **Dylan O'Connor** 32nd in the 500 free and Bovich 35th in the 100 back.

The team also ranked 3rd in the Michigan Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association (MISCA) D2 Academic Team All-State 2022 Honors with a GPA of 3.70.

MEET YOUR DCS ATHLETIC TRAINERS



Shannon Siira, MS, AT, ATC - Shannon has been an athletic trainer for almost 10 years working for Michigan Medicine through her entire career, at Dexter High School for the past 7 years and at Livonia Franklin High School prior to that. She attended Central Michigan University for her bachelor's degree in athletic training/sports medicine, and A.T. Still University for her masters in Kinesiology with an emphasis in Sport Psychology. She lives in Farmington Hills with her husband, two children, and dog. She loves to be outside, read a good book, and spend time with her family and friends when she is not working.



Kristin Stoneberg, MS, AT, ATC - Kristin spent the first 17 years of athletic training experience in Minnesota and Iowa before moving to Michigan in March 2022. She worked at the University of St Thomas (MN) for 14 years prior to joining Michigan Medicine where she primarily worked with the women's volleyball, men's basketball, and track teams. Prior to UST she worked at St. Mary's University as an athletic trainer and assistant volleyball coach for 2 years. She attended Bethel University (MN) for her bachelor's degree in athletic training, and University of Northern Iowa for her master's in athletic training. She lives in Ypsilanti with her boyfriend. She enjoys working out, golfing, and spending time with her loved ones.

Athletic trainers are certified and licensed healthcare providers who specialize in acute care and the management and prevention of athletic injuries. Athletic trainers must complete a bachelor's degree and more recently a master's degree in athletic training and then sit for a board of certification exam to become a certified athletic trainer.

Dexter High Schools contracts two athletic trainers, employed by Michigan Medicine. We complete part of the contract at the Ann Arbor Ice Cube physical therapy clinic providing rehabilitative care to a variety of populations with sport injuries and the other part at Dexter High School providing practice and game coverage, injury prevention and rehabilitation interventions, and emergency action planning. We work closely with a variety of health care professionals such as physical therapists, surgeons, physicians, and physician assistants to provide the best possible care for our athletes.

5 FACTS YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT ATHLETIC TRAINERS

- 1. Athletic trainers are certified and licensed, much like a physical therapist, physician assistant or doctor, to provide medical care and expertise for a variety of conditions and injuries.
- 2. We have access to some of the finest surgeons and physicians in Michigan with just a quick email or phone call.
- 3. It may look like we have an easy job, standing on the sideline or sitting on the gator, but we are keeping alert to potential injury and available for any emergency scenario you can think of, in a matter of seconds.
- 4. Athletic trainers are found in a variety of settings including high schools, colleges, professional sports, youth sports, PT clinics, physician offices, military, law enforcement, industrial warehouses, corporate settings, fine arts, and theater.
- 5. Athletic trainers get just as excited for game days as athletes do!

The Dexter Iron Dread powerlifting had another strong year in 2022 with both the varsity and JV mens' teams claiming regional titles. The JV women also won another regional title and the varsity women finished finish in second-place.

Junior **Corey Baker** performed an amazing 620lb deadlift at the MHSPLA state meet. Junior **Cole Darby** deadlifted 405lbs at the 145 lbs bodyweight at the Iron Dread Regional Meet. Freshman **Rayne Cook** broke the state record for bench press (145 lbs) in the 242 lb JV weight class.

Dexter once again hosted the Iron Dread Regional Meet in the DHS Gym with over 450 competitors. The team sent over 30 athletes to states in both mens' and women's Varsity and JV, Powerlifting continues to grow as a newer sport at Dexter, with over 100 student athletes on our roster this year.
