# Gifted Identification

While all children have gifts and talents, not all children are considered "gifted." Northwest Local understands the need for educational opportunities for students who demonstrate exceptional cognitive and academic skills. Gifted identification begins as young as kindergarten. Students who qualify for services in grades K-3 have access to enriched curriculum opportunities in reading and mathematics. Students in 4th and 5th grade who qualify for services have access to our gifted ELA and math courses. Students in middle school and high school have access to enriched courses, AP courses, and College Credit Plus courses. All students in kindergarten through eleventh grade participate in whole-grade academic screening third. In addition, second and fifth grade students participate in whole-grade gifted screening in the area of superior cognitive abilities and creative thinking. Parents may refer their child for gifted testing by requesting a referral form from their building administrator and returning the form by May 1, 2018. # **Brooks Gibbs Encourages** Resilience

As parents, teachers, and community members continue to encourage kindness and prevent bullying in all forms, Brooks Gibbs added another "protective layer" to the issue: Resilience. Brooks Gibbs,



author of Raise Them Strong: Building Resilient Kids and Love is Greater than Hate, shared his message with parents and with middle school and high school students on February 20th and 21st. At the core of his message was what to do when people are *not* kind. How can students handle exclusion, name calling, and even sibling squabbles? By building up emotional resilience and by trying to remain "unfazed" by minor infractions. Learned helplessness and entitlement are often the results of good-intentioned parenting. Instead, he encourages students

to solve social problems independently and to listen to their own truth, not the messages of those who aim to bring us down, make us uncomfortable, and block our success. He further encouraged them not to seek approval from everyone—be content with a few friends and practice flexibility. Northwest was honored to invite this awardwinning speaker who has spoken at over 2,500 schools empowering teens to make good choices and manage their emotions.

On February 8th, students challenged






# Mamma Mia


