# RISING 2ND GRADE STUDENTS' SUMMER READING AND MATH

Dear parents of rising second graders:

We hope you are enjoying the summer with your soon-to-be second grader! Summer is a great time to slow down, create memories, reflect on the Lord's goodness and prepare for the upcoming school year.

The second grade teachers encourage the continuation of reading and math practices throughout the summer. Research has shown that reading great books and practicing math skills during the summer months are vital in student success, developing a love for learning and building confidence for the upcoming school year. There are two ways in which we will nurture this: our summer reading program and utilizing math websites.

#### Summer Reading Program:

Rising second grade students are required to participate in the summer reading program. Students are asked to read 40 books. For every 10 books read, at least 2 need to be chapter books. Both independent reading and shared reading between parent and student may be recorded.

For every 10 books read, the student will receive a coupon from Chick-fil-A. The coupons will be given out at the beginning of the school year. Completing the attached form is required to receive coupons and to participate in the class breakfast.

# RISING 3RD GRADE STUDENTS' SUMMER READING AND MATH

Dear parents of rising third graders,

Happy summer! We eagerly anticipate meeting our new third graders in August, and there are a few things we want to invite you to do this summer to ensure your student arrives in August ready for the challenges of third grade.

**First of all, please encourage your student to read during the summer.** Summer is a time when students should feel free to read whatever they love— explore new genres, enjoy favorite picture books, dive deep into chapter books, browse through comics and graphic novels. They can read alone, read to you, or listen to books read aloud. You can take books outside to read, or make a blanket fort and crawl inside with a story. It doesn't matter what books you read or where you read, but **we cannot overstate reading's importance for the growth and development of rising third graders!** Students are encouraged to participate in the Chick-fil-A summer reading program and read four chapter books to record on the included sheet. This sheet can be turned in the first week of school for delicious rewards from Chick-fil-A!

Secondly, **it is imperative that all rising third graders know their addition and subtraction facts fluently** (i.e. they can answer automatically without counting). In third grade, we move quickly towards multiplication, and students who do not know their facts struggle to keep up. Use games, apps, or flashcards to keep these fresh in your child's mind while making it feel fun to practice. Once they are confident in addition and subtraction, you can start working to learn the multiplication facts through 10 x 10!

Your summer activities should include taking your children to the public library to check out books of interest and/or joining summer reading groups.

Rising fourth graders are required to read at least one book. **Students will receive a 100 TEST GRADE in reading for completing this REQUIRED assignment.** Students who read more than one book **will be rewarded from the Chick-fil-A Summer Reading Program.** 

Parents and students may choose chapter books **based on interest of the student.** All books must have **at least 100 pages and be on a 4th grade reading level.** Parents can use this <u>book leveler</u> to check the level of their books if it is not indicated on the book. Students will list each book read, including the number of pages and author. Parent or guardian must sign stating the child has read the book.

Documentation of the summer reading is to be turned in to the student's teacher **by Friday of the first full week of school.** Children completing this assignment will also receive their individual earned prize or prizes (coupons from Chick-fil-A). HGCS is very intentional in their efforts to ensure all students have the opportunity to be successful. Research has proven there is a direct correlation between reading and success in learning. It has been shown that children who read over the summer will benefit in the following areas: reading comprehension, writing style, vocabulary, spelling and grammatical development. A non-academic summer can cause students at every grade level to digress two to three months in their academic skills.

Tapping into your child's personal interests can help foster a love of reading (e.g., a favorite movie can help identify a preferred genre). Reading for pleasure can stimulate creativity and imagination. Set aside time for your student to read each day during summer break—20 to 30 minutes per day is all it takes! In the summer, students have more time to **read for enjoyment,** which also offers a great opportunity to preserve and strengthen their reading skills. Your summer activities should include taking your children to the public library to check out books of interest and/or joining summer reading groups.

Rising fifth graders are required to read 1-4 books. Parents and students may choose chapter books based on interest of the student. All books must have at least 150 pages and be on a **5th grade reading level.** Students should select one fiction and one non-fiction text from the grade level book list to read during June and July. For the other two titles, students may select any other titles on the list.

Students will list each book read, including the number of pages and author. A parent or guardian must sign stating the child has read the book or the reward will not be given (see the Elementary Summer Reading form below). **Students will receive a 100 TEST GRADE in reading for completing this REQUIRED assignment.** Students who read more than one book will be **rewarded from the Chick-fil-A Summer Reading Program.** 

Documentation of the summer reading is to be turned in to the student's teacher by **Friday of the first full week of school.** Students completing this assignment will also receive their individual earned prize or prizes (coupons from Chick-fil-A). We look forward to celebrating your summer reading with a Chick-fil-A breakfast.
