From the Superintendent

We have successfully finished another school year and we survived some interesting and challenging weather throughout the year! Remember, we had the Solar Eclipse in

August; we had to cancel school due to a major wind storm in November, and we cancelled school five times due to poor road conditions this winter!

Now that the school year is over, our district has transitioned to the summer activities. We have several small projects throughout the district and one large physical change that is underway. Our turf and the track at the high school stadium are being replaced this year. It has been nearly 20 years since the track was resurfaced and our turf has endured ten seasons of wear and tear.

Our district has earned many great distinctions in the past and this school year was no exception. AHS was recognized by U.S. News & World Report as one of the finest high schools in the state of Ohio and in the entire nation. AHS was ranked 13th in the state and 370th in the nation out of more than 25,000 high schools. Both of those rankings put us in the top 2% of all schools! Aurora High School was honored by the Ohio Department of Education with the Momentum Award. This is granted to buildings in Ohio based on the fact they exceeded their expected student growth in achievement. College

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U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKS AHS TOP 2% IN STATE AND NATIONALLY

Aurora High School (AHS) has been ranked #3 in Northeast Ohio and #13 in Ohio in the Best High Schools article by U.S. News & World Report for 2018. Earning this Gold Medal distinction (indicating the greatest level of college readiness) places AHS at #370 in the country. The gold medal rating is given to only 500 schools nationwide calculated by using College Readiness Index student performance results.

AHS Principal, Paul Milcetich, stated, "Any time AHS is included in recognition with some of the finest public high schools in our area, state, and the country, it is always an honor. U.S. News and World

Report does a thorough job of ranking schools by including state test scores, AP tests and passage, as well as a College Readiness measure, so we believe it is a quality metric with which to view the progress of our school. That being said, it is one metric and does not capture all that makes Aurora High School a great learning environment in terms of development of the "whole" student, which means academically but also artistically, athletically, and in the area of character with points of emphasis, such as service. We are blessed with outstanding students, a supportive community, and a staff that focuses on nurturing the growth

of our students, which ultimately leads to this type of affirmation. We are proud of what we achieve at Aurora High School but every year we continue to look at areas we could refine and improve for the benefit of our students and their learning."

Regarding this honor, Aurora Schools' Superintendent, Pat Ciccantelli, said, "Congratulations to our board of education, administration, faculty and staff for being a part of helping these students earn this level of distinction. Congratulations to the students and their families for hard work and commitment to education."

Board shared our ACT scores with us from the past year this fall and our composite average for our students was an outstanding 25.1; significantly exceeding the state and national averages and our highest score in school history! We had our annual athletic and academic signing recognition programs boasting 5 student-athletes and 9 scholars signing scholarships to prestigious universities.

Our district's academic reputation is outstanding and our reputation for service easily rivals our status in academics. Our Service Learning course students hosted our annual Veteran's Day breakfast in November. One fundraiser, "Aurora for Others" raised over \$9,000 for three separate charities. In our Service Learning course at AHS they provided financial support to several charities and spent the night in their own "Shantytown" bringing awareness to homelessness. Our National Honor Society students provided services and support to nearly a dozen groups. Several of our groups were involved with the local community Aurora Food Pantry fundraiser titled "Fill a Bag-Feed a Family." There are literally too many examples to mention here, but I am moved and touched by the generosity and compassion of our students and staff.

Our students continue to shine both inside and outside of the classroom. Inside the classroom, thirty-three of our students graduated Summa Cum Laude, meaning they had a 4.0 GPA or higher for all four years! Also, nearly 900 students completed Advanced Placement courses (AP) and the corresponding exam. Outside of the classroom. congratulations to Boys' Soccer, Wrestling, Girls' Basketball and Softball for earning Suburban league titles! The football team qualified for the state playoffs for the 13th consecutive year and our bovs' soccer team finished a fantastic season losing a heartbreaking game in the state semi-finals! In the visual arts programs, our students continue to achieve at the highest levels. Numerous students earned Gold Key status at the state level. Our musical concerts and our theater performances continue to amaze our community! These are just some of our outstanding accomplishments.

We have over 230 new AHS alumni!

Graduation was a special evening for the graduates and their families. The class of 2018 benefited from a total of 8.6 million dollars of scholarships, including over \$150,000 in local scholarship money! Thank you to the numerous organizations that support our students as they move on to higher education. The two schools that will become home for the greatest number of our graduates: Kent State University and The Ohio State University.

There will be some new faces in our district next year! We had eleven employees retire during this past school year. We will miss the following staff members who represent nearly 250 years of service in Aurora and over 350 years in total to education: John Calcei, Liz Fuller, Paul Goodwin, Jane Ivans, Alicia Jimenez, Amy Lange, Nancy Petru, Sherry Rogalski, Nancy Shepard, Kathy O'Haire, and Sharron Weingart.

I hope your child had many memorable experiences this year! We had several opportunities where our students traveled off our campus to gain valuable learning experiences. Our 6th grade students had their annual Camp retreat, our 8th grade students traveled to Washington D.C., to tour our nation's capital, and our marching band performed at Walt Disney World in Orlando, Florida just to name a few.

Our success is due to the tremendous support from the community and we appreciate the great partnership we have with our many stakeholders. They received the 2017 award for "excellence in financial reporting in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and compliance with applicable law for the fiscal year ended 2017." The award means that an entities, "financial audit did not contain findings for recovery, material citations, material weakness. significant deficiencies, Single Audit findings or any questioned costs." The award is given retroactively for the previous year. East Regional Liaison, Jim Shaw, from the State of Ohio Auditor's Office in Youngstown, Ohio presented the award to Volosin on Thursday, February 8, 2018.

The award, given by Auditor of State, David Yost, states that, "the citizens you represent are well-served by your effective and accountable financial practices." Yost added that, "clean and accurate record-keeping are the foundation for good government, and the taxpayers can take pride in your commitment to accountability."

The Aurora City Schools'Treasurer's Department consists of William Volosin, Treasurer; Diane Ebie, Payroll Manager and Pam Prochaska, Accounts Manager. Volosin, explained, "We were notified by the Auditor of State's Office that we have received the Auditor of State Award for Fiscal Year 2017. The Auditor of State Award is given to those entities that file timely financial reports in accordance with GAAP, as well as receive a "clean" audit report. This award is a result of all of the hard work and effort of the individuals in my office, Diane Ebie and Pam Prochaska, along with the work of the district secretaries, food service head cooks, operations and athletic department staff who all have a responsibility for working with the financial information of the District.



Advanced Placement Program

The College Board has announced that two Aurora High School 2017 graduates performed so well on the AP Studio Art Drawing Portfolio Exam in May of 2017 that they have fallen into a very select category.

The Advanced Placement Exams are scored on a 5-point scale with a 5 being equivalent to a grade of A in the corresponding course. Both Caeley Blechschmid and Alyssa Korecky not only scored a 5 on the test, but were

also among only 15 students in the world to earn every point possible on the AP Studio Art Drawing Portfolio Exam receiving the maximum score on each portion of the exam.

In a letter, College Board Senior Vice President of AP and Instruction, Trevor Packer, stated, "These extraordinary academic accomplishments are likely a direct reflection of the top-quality education being offered at Aurora High School.
