

Did you know?...There's a library of smells in France. The Osmothèque is a library of smells in Versailles, France. Founded in 1990, the Osmothèque is a repository for perfumes and contains over 3,200 scents, some 400 of which are no longer made. The collection is an archive of perfume-making history, and many fragrance houses and parfumiers have kindly donated samples of perfumes, both current and historical, in order to safeguard their formulas.








Did you know?...Vermont is home to a library that stretches across the U.S. border to Canada.

The Haskell Free Library and Opera House sits directly on the border between the United States and Canada. You can walk in from Stanstead, Quebec, and walk out into Derby Line, Vermont. You don't need a passport to cross the (literal) line running through the building, but you do have to return to your country of origin or risk fines.
