INSTRUCTION BP 6142.1

Sexual Health and HIV/AIDS Prevention Instruction

The Governing Board desires to provide a well-planned, integrated sequence of medically accurate and inclusive instruction on comprehensive sexual health and human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) prevention. The district's educational program shall address the goals of the California Healthy Youth Act pursuant to Education Code 51930-51939, including providing students with the knowledge and skills necessary to protect them from risks presented by sexually transmitted infections, unintended pregnancy, sexual harassment, sexual assault, sexual abuse, and human trafficking and to have healthy, positive, and safe relationships and behaviors. The district's educational program shall also promote the understanding of sexuality as a normal part of human development and the development of healthy attitudes and behaviors concerning adolescent growth and development, body image, gender roles, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, relationships, marriage, and family

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The district shall respect the rights of parents/guardians to supervise their children's education on these subjects and to impart values regarding human sexuality to their children.

Comprehensive sexual health education and HIV prevention education shall be offered to all students in grades 7-12, including at least once in junior high or middle school and at least once in high school. (Education Code 51934)

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The district's comprehensive sexual health education program shall include information on the affirmative consent standard. Affirmative consent is defined as affirmative, conscious, and voluntary agreement to engage in sexual activity. Teachers delivering such content shall consult information related to sexual harassment and violence in the state health curriculum framework. (Education Code 51225.36, 67386)

Availability of Condoms

The Board of Education strongly encourages students to abstain from sexual activity. However, the Board also believes it has a responsibility to take steps to prevent pregnancy among minors, Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) infection and Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), and other sexually transmitted infections among students who do not abstain from sexual activity.

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Condoms, when properly used, may reduce the incidence of pregnancy and transmission of HIV and other sexually transmitted infections. The Board therefore finds it appropriate for condoms to be available to students at high schools.

BP 6142.1

Condoms shall be available, as resources permit and at no cost to the district, to individual high school students at locations identified by the Superintendent or designee. Related information shall be provided at the same locations, and a licensed health care professional shall be available to counsel students.

Condoms shall be provided in their original packaging, along with the manufacturer's instructions. Students shall receive additional information as appropriate and necessary regarding the proper use of condoms and their effectiveness.

Verbal and/or written information shall be provided to students obtaining condoms that emphasizes that abstinence is the only 100% effective method of preventing pregnancy, HIV transmission, and sexually transmitted infections and that does not condone or in any way encourage sexual activity among or with minors.

The Superintendent or designee will appoint a coordinator and an advisory committee regarding the district's condom availability program. This advisory committee shall represent a divergence of viewpoints and will participate in planning, implementing and evaluating the district's condom availability program. The Board shall consider the advisory committee's recommendations when approving the district's program.

The Superintendent or designee shall identify appropriate methods for informing the school community about subjects related to the district's comprehensive sexual health and HIV prevention education, including the availability of condoms at high schools. The Superintendent or designee shall use such identified methods to inform parents/guardians of students in grades 6-12 about human trafficking prevention resources, as required pursuant to Education Code 49381.

Parent/Guardian Consent

At the beginning of each school year or at the time of a student's enrollment, parents/guardians shall be notified, in the manner specified in the accompanying administrative regulation that they may request in writing that their child be excused from participating in HIV/AIDS prevention and comprehensive sexual health education. Students so excused by their parents/guardians shall be given an alternative educational activity. (Education Code 51240, 51938, 51939)

A student shall not be subject to disciplinary action, academic penalty, or other sanction if the student's parent/guardian declines to permit the student to receive the instruction. (Education Code 51939)
