

Board Action Items:

Middle School Sports Kent Glaser, director of athletics and activities, provided an update on middle school athletics. Glaser shared details about expanded opportunities for middle school students to play basketball, allowing seventh grade students to play basketball as well as eighth graders. Board Policy Board of Education members held a second reading and approved the following policy:

Administrative Contracts Approved The Board of Education approved a 1.84 percent overall compensation for administrators. Most administrators will receive a 2 percent increase in their 2022-2023 base salary, except in cases of market-based adjustments, as appropriate. Classified salaries have previously been approved. (This included a 1% increase on the base salary and step movement, providing an average of 3.62% in the overall compensation package for classified employees.) In addition, there is a tentative agreement with certified staff.

The Board of Education also approved Superintendent Dr. Michelle Hubbard's contract for the 2022-2023 school year. Later in the meeting Dr. Hubbard thanked the Board, expressed

appreciation for those she worked with during her first year as superintendent, and shared her excitement for the next school year.

APPLY Kansas All Stars Shawnee Mission South and Shawnee Mission West high schools were named 2022 All Stars as part of the APPLY Kansas campaign. These awards, presented for the first time this

year, were announced at the June Kansas Board of Regents meeting. The APPLY Kansas Campaign is a statewide program, sponsored by the Kansas Board of Regents, which aims to increase students' post-secondary planning. Both schools held events that provided students and their families dedicated time and support as they completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid and filled out college applications. They also held a college signing day, celebrating the different paths seniors choose after graduation. Superintendent Dr. Michelle Hubbard congratulated the educators, students, and families at these schools for all they have done to help students get ready for college and careers!



Leadership Shawnee Mission This month, the Shawnee Mission Education Foundation hosted its fifth year of Leadership Shawnee Mission. This leadership development

program for SMSD juniors and seniors is held in partnership with

William Jewell College and its Tucker Leadership lab. Educators across the district nominate students they think are strong candidates. Less than 1 percent of SMSD sophomores and juniors are invited to participate. Once accepted into the program, they explore topics like conflict resolution, communication, responsibility, and trust. They also have the opportunity to work with career mentors as part of their leadership development.

Graduates of the program this year expressed gratitude for the way the program connected them to peers and mentors who will positively impact their life, for the friendships they formed, and for everything they learned about how to become the leaders they want to be.

This was especially clear as the Foundation celebrated the five year anniversary of the program. Students from all graduating classes of Leadership Shawnee Mission gathered for a reunion event held here at the CAA. Dr. Hubbard congratulated all of these Leadership Shawnee Mission graduates and the Foundation for all they have done to develop leaders in the SMSD and our community!
