As you probably know, most of the school have enjoyed the sights and sounds of Wakehurst Place!

However one class ran out of time during their visit to have a workshop so they were given an opportunity to do a little bit of fieldwork and find out more about our environment. Earlier this week, Turner class were visited by some experts from Wakehurst!









The children had a breezy summer day and a tray full of equipment to take note of their surroundings and come up with some data of their own, including activities like;

- Measuring the temperature of the soil and the air.
- Using a trowel to discover the texture, colour and feel of the soil, and an auger to screw down into the soil to see whether there were different layers.
- Blowing bubbles and using a compass to describe what direction they were heading and where the wind was coming from.
- Using a bar and ribbon and a Beaufort scale card to indicate the likely strength and potential km per hour the wind was travelling.

It was great to have some hands on learning tied to their Science from last term, spend the afternoon using new equipment and working as a team to find out what they could.
