

GlenOak High School College Credit Plus 2022-2023



- College Credit Plus is Ohio's dual enrollment program that provides students in grades 7-12 the opportunity to earn college and high school credits simultaneously by taking courses from Ohio colleges or universities.
- The purpose of this program is to enhance students' career readiness and postsecondary success, while providing a wide variety of options to college-ready students, at no or limited costs to students and families.
- Students may take up to 30 college credit hours per year, minus three hours for every high school credit in which they are enrolled. A maximum total of 120 credit hours can be earned through CCP.
- > Students who register for more than 30 credit hours will be responsible to pay for the *entire* course that placed them over the 30 hours limit.



- Classes can be taken at the college campus, and at the high school, in person, and online.
- Classes can be taken in the summer, fall and spring semesters.
- Students must meet minimum eligibility criteria in order to qualify for CCP.
- Credit will be applied to the high school transcript and GPA.

Credit conversion

- 3+ college credit hours=1 high school credit 2 college credit hours=.66 high school credits 1 college credit hour=.33 high school credits
- Weighted grades: CCP grades are weighted on a 5.0 scale if there is a similarly weighted AP or IB course taught in the same subject area.



Non-Allowable Courses:

These courses are not permitted under College Credit Plus:

- > Study Abroad courses
- Physical Education courses
- Religious courses
- Pass/Fail courses
- Remedial courses
- Courses with substantially high fees



The following courses are taught at GlenOak High School by teachers who have adjunct status at the college:

- College Composition I
- British Literature
- Medical Terminology

Career-Tech Programs at GlenOak with embedded CCP coursework:

- Commercial Photography (optional CCP Kent Stark)
- Teacher Pathway (optional CCP -Stark State)
- Emergency Fire Services (required CCP Stark State)
- Advancement to Nursing (optional CCP Aultman College)





Things to consider:



- Aside from academic preparedness, is the student socially and developmentally ready to handle taking classes with adults? The content, presentation and classroom discourse is not modified at all based on the student's status as a minor. Mature Content waiver is required for participation.
- CCP coursework officially begins the student's college transcript, which must be disclosed on future college applications. All CCP grades become a part of the student's permanent academic record (high school and college).
- Once the minor student enrolls in CCP, FERPA applies, meaning that parents won't have rights to their student's academic records without their permission, and the professors/university cannot communicate with parents directly regarding their academic performance.
- Scheduling logistics: What do I want to take at GlenOak, and can I fit my CCP courses around it? You may not arrive late or leave early to attend a CCP class at the campus.





Deciding to Participate in CCP

Things to consider:

- In the event of course failure, students/families will be billed for the course, and the student could be academically dismissed from the university.
- If the student's overall CCP GPA falls below a 2.0, or if the student withdraws from two or more courses in a semester, the student will be placed on CCP Probation by the school district per Ohio Revised Code.
- > Students on CCP probation may only enroll in one (1) CCP course moving forward until the CCP cumulative GPA is a 2.0 or higher.





How to obtain initial eligibility for CCP:

Per Ohio Revised Code, students must demonstrate the initial eligibility for CCP via remediation-free score on an approved college readiness assessment such as the ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer, (or a 3.0 cumulative GPA - pending state legislation.)

Although you may qualify for the program, in some cases, the university may require specific scores that are higher than the remediation free score for certain courses.

Scores *expire* two years from the date of testing.

How do we test?

The Accuplacer is a web-based college readiness exam that can be taken on a chromebook or other device and is scored on the spot. GlenOak High School students may take the Accuplacer at GlenOak high school on two dates only:

February 10th & February 17th, 2022

Students may sign up online to register for their time slot during a time you have a study hall at https://tinyurl.com/GOHS-Accuplacer. If you do not have a study hall, you may choose "period 8" for an after school time slot.




ACT/SAT:

- > Students may use an existing ACT or SAT score to qualify for CCP, as long as it is still valid (less than two years old).
- Juniors who take the school-based ACT scheduled for March 1, 2022 may use this test for CCP eligibility purposes. Students have been automatically registered for this test, and there is nothing you need to do to register.
- If the student has already registered to take the Feb National ACT or the March SAT, those scores will meet the deadline and can be used for CCP purposes.



Four Steps to Access CCP



- **1.** Apply to the university through the college's website.
- **2.** Take the Accuplacer test if you do not already have an eligible college readiness score on the ACT or SAT. (Scores expire in two years from the date of the test).
- **3.** Turn in CCP Intent form by the deadline (3/4 for CCP taught at GOHS; 4/1 for CCP at the campus). This will trigger the counselor to send your transcripts and test scores to the university. CCP Intent forms can be found in the school Counseling office. If you are choosing classes taught at GlenOak (i.e. College Comp, Brit Lit, Med Term), please make sure that you also remember to fill out the Course Selection sheet that is attached to the CCP Intent Form. This is the only way we will know which CCP classes at GlenOak you want to take.
- **4.** Upon your acceptance to the college, make an advising appointment at the college to register for classes, and forward a copy of your college schedule to your School Counselor. *NOTE this step is for students taking courses AT the college only).
