PROHIBITION OF THE USE OF HATE SPEECH, ETHNICALLY OR RACIALLY INSENSITIVE EXPRESSIONS IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

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I. GOVERNING POLICY: JFCB: RESPECT, ETHICS AND INTEGRITY IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

II. **DEFINITION**

Hate Speech – abusive or threatening speech, writing, or action that expresses prejudice against a particular group, especially on the basis of race, religion, or sexual orientation.

11 III. GENERALLY

This regulation reflects Virginia High School League (VHSL) Policy 27-16-1, Use of
 Hate Speech, Ethnically or Racially Insensitive Expressions, effective November 9, 2021.
 However, School Board Policy JFCB and this regulation apply to all ACPS-approved extracurricular activities, and are not limited to those governed by VHSL.

19Alexandria City Public Schools (ACPS) is committed to providing an environment that20respects every individual. In alignment with School Board Policies JB:21Nondiscrimination in Education, and JFHA/GBA: Prohibition Against Harassment,22Bullying, Hostile Work Environment and Retaliation, all individuals participating in or23attending ACPS-approved, extracurricular activities are prohibited from using hate24speech, ethnically, or racially insensitive expressions against students, athletes, coaches,25staff members and officials.

Any coach, staff member, team personnel and/or participant who confronts or addresses a coach, staff member, participant or official using hate speech, ethnically or racially insensitive expressions will be disqualified from participating in the meeting or competition and will be ineligible for the team's next scheduled competition (or activity's next meeting) and/or subsequent competitions/meetings until penalties and educational/restorative interventions are completed.

34Note:For the 2021-2022 school year, the disqualification for VHSL-regulated35activities will be a one-game/competition suspension. VHSL may increase this to a36two- or three-game/competition suspension for the 2022-23 school year. For the372021-2022 school year, educational/restorative interventions are recommended by38VHSL. Beginning July 1, 2022, educational/restorative interventions are required39for any person violating this regulation.

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56		In addition to ACPS' administrative responses discussed above:		
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58		• ACPS will inform VHSL of any alleged incident involving the use of		
59		hate speech, ethnically or racially insensitive expressions within two		
60		working days after the school administration becomes aware of the		
61		incident.		
62		• VHSL will send a copy of the report to the principal of each school		
63		involved.		
64 65		• Within five working days of receiving the report, each principal files a response or provides information concerning the incident to VHSL.		
66		 A VHSL committee consisting of three or four principals, athletic 		
67		directors, and coaches will review the incident report and response		
68		from each school involved. Following the completion of the review,		
69		the committee will make a recommendation to the VHSL Executive		
70		Director and/or designee for action.		
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72		2. VHSL Penalties		
73		The following terms represent VHSL consequences that will be referred to in		
74		interpreting a violation of using hate speech, ethnically or racially insensitive		
75		expression.		
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77		• Ejection - Any coach, team personnel and/or contestant who confronts		
78 70		or addresses a coach, contestant, or official using hate speech,		
79 80		ethnically or racially insensitive expression will be disqualified for the remainder of the contest.		
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81		• Player/Coach Suspension - Any coach, team personnel and/or		
82		contestant who is ejected from a contest for using hate speech or other control of the contest in a specific the speech of the		
83 84		ethnically or racially insensitive expressions will be ineligible for the team's next scheduled contest. If a coach or player commits a second		
85		offense, he/she will be ineligible for the remainder of that		
86		sport/activity season.		
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<u>Note:</u> For the 2021-2022 school year, disqualification will continue as a one-game suspension. For the 2022-2023 school year, the suspension may increase to a two- or three-game suspension.

- School Warning A school's program may be placed on warning status for a one-year period of time by the VHSL Sportsmanship Committee for repeated infractions of using hate speech, ethnically or racially insensitive expression.
 - School Probation Probation is a more severe penalty, based on repeated offenses with-in a two-year period of time by the same program or cumulative warnings over a period of time within the school. A school or program on probation may not enter any play-off toward a district, regional, or state championship nor may the school enter any sanctioned event.
 - School Suspension A school suspended from the VHSL may not compete in interscholastic competition of any kind with a member of the VHSL or a school that is a member of another state associated with the National Federation of State High School Associations.
 - School Fine A fine not to exceed \$1,000 may be levied by VHSL with or without any other penalty on a school. Failure to report violations involving the use of hate speech, ethnically or racially insensitive expression will result in a fine per occurrence.

- 112 A decision may be appealed to the VHSL Sportsmanship Committee.

113 V. TRAINING AND NOTIFICATION TO STUDENTS, PARENTS/GUARDIANS 114 AND COACHES

- ACPS coaches and/or supervising staff members will receive training on modeling, communicating and upholding expectations for behavior related to cultural awareness, equity and good sportsmanship.
- In addition, schools will hold participant, parent/guardian and coach/supervising
 staff member preseason meetings to discuss ACPS/VHSL expectations for student,
 parent/guardian, coach, and spectator behavior related to cultural awareness, equity and
 sportsmanship.

123Note: For the 2021-2022 school year, preseason meetings with parents/guardians,124players and coaches are recommended. For the 2022-2023 school year, preseason125meetings will be required.
