48 B. Employees

- (EAP) Employee Assistance Program (offers immediate, no-cost assistance for emotional or work-life counseling, financial information, and legal support and resources); and
- Health Insurance Carrier Wellness Resources (such as Total Health Assessment Surveys, health guides on fitness, nutrition and recipes, preventive care, weight management, and more).

V. **DEFINITIONS**

"Tobacco product" means any product made of tobacco and includes cigarettes, cigars, smokeless tobacco, pipe tobacco, bidis, and wrappings as defined in Va. Code § 18.2-371.2. "Tobacco product" does not include any nicotine vapor product, alternative nicotine product, or product that is regulated by the FDA under Chapter V (21 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

"Nicotine vapor product" means any noncombustible product containing nicotine that employs a heating element, power source, electronic circuit, or other electronic, chemical, or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size, that can be used to produce vapor from nicotine in a solution or other form. "Nicotine vapor product" includes any electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device and any cartridge or other container of nicotine in a solution or other form that is intended to be used with or in an electronic cigarette, electronic cigar, electronic cigarillo, electronic pipe, or similar product or device, as defined in Va. Code_§ 18.2-371.2. "Nicotine vapor product" does not include any product regulated by the FDA under Chapter V (21 U.S.C. § 351 et seq.) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act.

"School property" means all property owned, leased, rented or otherwise used by a school, including but not limited to the following:

- All interior portions of any building or other structure used for instruction, administration, support services, maintenance, or storage;
- Any indoor facility or portion of such facility owned or leased or contracted for and used for the provision of regular or routine health care, day care, or early childhood development (Head Start) services;
- All vehicles used by the Division for transporting students, staff, visitors or other persons; and
- The grounds of any building or other structure used for instruction, administration, sporting events, support services, maintenance, or storage.
