School Closure Update

3/31/20

We have included some updates below from the district in regards to where things stand on some items for the remainder of the school year.

Before going through each of those, I do want to say that we appreciate the effort that everyone is putting forth in this current setting. We know that some subjects are more difficult than others — making it more difficult for you to assist your child/children. We know that there may be multiple children at home that need assistance and/or computer time. We know that everyone is very stressed with jobs, healthcare, schoolwork, families, etc. — we are too. At the same time, as a school district it is our job and responsibility to continue to try to teach students as best we can. All we ask is that everyone do the best they can with the situation at hand — that is all any of us can do.

Please keep in mind that not a one of our teachers were hired because they could teach online classes. They were hired to do a job that involves a roomful of kiddos. They have done a tremendous job transitioning and adapting to this new environment for learning. Obviously some people are more advanced and comfortable than others in dealing with tech-related teaching and learning. Those who were not so computer savvy have done a great job improving their skills in a very short amount of time. Every staff member will continue to improve their skills and become more comfortable in what they are doing – but it is not the same as having students in the classroom.

Thank you for your patience and cooperation through all of this. Here are a few updates from the district:

8th **Grade trip to Washington DC** – has not been cancelled/postponed by the travel company as of yet. However, the school district will try to work with the company to establish alternate dates for the trip in the event it does get re-scheduled rather than cancelled completely. There may not be much flexibility in the dates we are given. Refunds will not be available as stated in the paperwork families completed when registering for the trip.

Italy/Greece Trip – has already been postponed until the summer of 2021.

Prom – we hope to be able to host some form of prom this year. However, details for this will not be worked out until we get a better idea of what the current situation looks like in the months ahead. Due to circumstances beyond our control it may not be as formal as previous years.

Graduation – graduation is still on our calendar for the end of May. We have had some informal discussions about alternatives in the event we are not able to do this in May. Again, depending upon the circumstances, we may have to get creative and it may or may not be a "typical" graduation ceremony.

School Work – teachers will continue to put lessons online. If there is something your child does not understand, please use the email button in Schoology to reach out to the classroom teacher. If the classroom teacher is dismissive of those requests, please contact the building principal. Teachers will continue to enter grades in ProgressBook for the 4th quarter as they normally would. The district will make a determination at a later date, but may consider changing grades to pass/fail for the 4th quarter. Students are still responsible to complete their school work as posted online. Even if students do not

completely understand something they should still show teachers they have tried in order to receive a passing grade.

Spring Break – the district will continue to maintain and recognize our schedule for spring break. Students will not be required to do any work (except missing or late work) April 9 - 13 and staff should not be posting any work during this time frame, nor will they be expected to respond to emails or posts during this time.

State Testing & End-of-Course Exams – testing will not take place for the remainder of the school year. End of course exams will not have an impact on those graduating this year. Those students who were on-track to graduate will be able to do so, assuming they complete their online coursework in a satisfactory manner.

Third Grade Reading Guarantee - Many third-grade students already met the promotion threshold after the fall administration of the third-grade English language arts assessment — either by achieving the necessary overall scale score or the reading subscore. Newly enacted Ohio law temporarily removes the requirement that a student meet the promotion threshold for the 2019-2020 school year to advance to fourth grade. Specifically, no school district shall retain a student in the third grade following the 2019-2020 school year based solely on the student's academic performance in reading. However, if the student's principal and reading teacher agree the student's reading skills demonstrate the student is reading below grade level and is not academically prepared to be promoted to fourth grade, the student may be retained.
