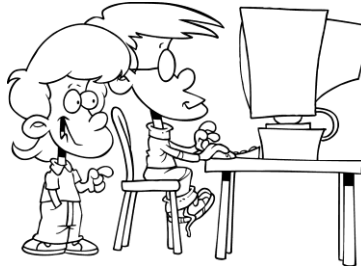

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21st Century Literacy

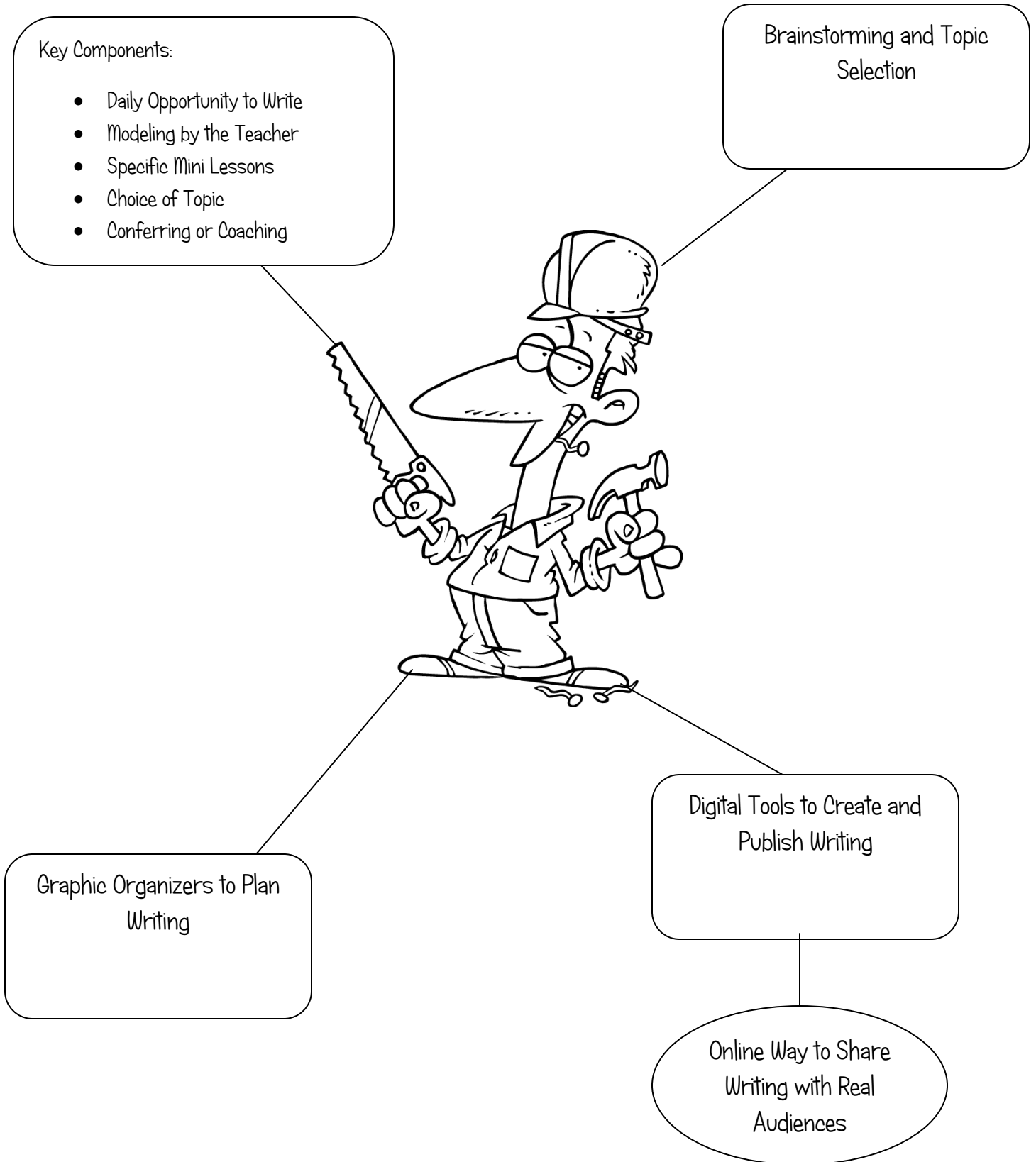
Twenty-first century readers and writers need to:

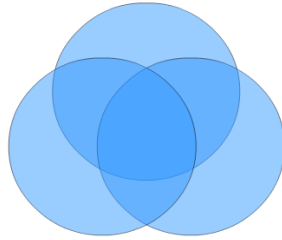
