




# A Message from Mrs. Lamplugh

# FLAVOUR OF THE MONTH

# White chocolate chip M&M cookies





#### Ingredients

150g salted butter, softened 200g plain chocolate chips or chunks 80g light brown sugar 225g gluten-free flour 80g granulated sugar 100g white chocolate 2 tsp vanilla extract Pack of M&Ms 1 large egg

#### Method

#### STEP 1

Heat the oven to 190C/fan170C/gas 5 and line two baking sheets with non-stick baking paper. STEP 2

Put 150g softened salted butter, 80g light brown muscovado sugar and 80g granulated sugar into a bowl and beat until creamy.

#### STEP 3

Beat in 2 tsp vanilla extract and 1 large egg. **STEP 4** 

Sift 225g gluten-free flour into the bowl and mix it in with a wooden spoon. Add 200g plain chocolate chips (or chunks), white chocolate and M&Ms stir well.

#### STEP 6

Use a teaspoon or tablespoon to roll the mixture into balls, spacing them well apart on the baking trays. This mixture should make about 18 cookies.

#### STEP 7

Bake for 10 mins until they are light brown on the edges and still crumbly and slightly soft in the centre.

#### STEP 8

Leave to cool, then enjoy!
