Talk Sup Week 39 Review and Preview

June 20, 2022



Good morning and happy Juneteenth and belated Father's Day! We hope you had a relaxing holiday weekend. Welcome to another edition of Talk Sup. This will be the last one of the 2021-22 school year. In fact, you will not receive another from me until September 11th. Please remember that we will dismiss students <u>early</u> today, June 20th and each day this week on June 21st and 22nd (students in grades 9-12). Likewise, please remember that the last day of school for students in preschool through 8th grade will be tomorrow,

Tuesday, June 21st, while the last day for students in grades 9-12, as well as 10-month instructional staff will be this Wednesday, June 22nd.



We hope that all our families took the time to celebrate and discuss with their children the importance of the Juneteenth holiday for our country, and especially African Americans. As you probably know, the holiday commemorates the day in which the abolishment of slavery was made into law in Texas and the final slaves were freed in Galveston on June 19, 1865,

which was two years after President Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation and nearly six months after the 13th Amendment to the

United States Constitution, which abolished slavery, was ratified. Although President Biden declared this a federal holiday last June, Texas has recognized it as a state holiday since 1980. However, people across the country have been celebrating this very special day of freedom long before that in Galveston and other communities, such as Buffalo, New York. While the federal holiday this year is June 20th, since New Jersey passed legislation in September 2020 recognizing the holiday on the 3rd Friday of June each year, we recently revised our 2021-22 School District Calendar so that our schools would be closed on June 17th.





As we put the finishing touches on yet another unprecedentedly challenging but productive school year and begin the long process of preparing for the 2022-23 school year, we would like to take the time to express to our staff and parents our sincere gratitude for EVERYTHING you did to either directly or indirectly promote the most positive outcomes for the children in Sayreville. Please understand that the Sayreville Board of Education, Administration, and I deeply appreciate and fiercely admire all that you do for our students. We know all too well how hard you work and how much you sacrifice every day for our children. In fact, not a day goes by in which I do not count my

blessings and feel forever grateful to have the privilege of serving this district and working alongside of you to make a difference in the precious lives of our students.

That said, the end of a school year is also a time for us to say goodbye. For those members of our staff who will be pressing on through the summer, we thank you in advance for extending learning and for helping us prepare for 2022-23. For those of you that will be leaving and returning in September, we wish you a relaxing and rejuvenating summer break, and anxiously await your safe return back to us. Finally, for those who will be leaving us for one reason or another, please know the indelible impact you have made on all of us, and how

grateful we are to you for the service you have provided to our district and most importantly, our students. Please remember that goodbyes are not forever, nor are they the end. They simply mean, we'll miss you until we see you again.



This week both the 8th Grade Promotion Ceremony, and the Class of 2022 Graduation Commencement Ceremony will take place in Bomber Stadium at 6 pm on Tuesday, June 21st and Wednesday, June 22nd respectively. There will be no capacity limits unless inclement weather forces them into the gymnasium, which according the latest weather forecasts, appears to be likely. If that is the case, because the ceremonies will then take place in the gymnasium, <u>two</u> people per student will be allowed to spectate in the gym while all other guests will be permitted to view the simulcast of it in the cafeteria, auditorium, or remotely elsewhere.

In addition, in accordance with our school security policy and procedures, <u>air horns</u> and <u>bags</u>, including <u>pocketbooks</u>, will be <u>prohibited</u> from being brought into the stadium or gym. The only exception to this will be parents of infants and toddlers who may need a bag to care for their children, and elderly and/or medically fragile guests that may need to have with them vital healthcare items. In such cases, these bags must be clear or seethrough. Lastly, pocketbooks that can be held in the palm of a hand will be permitted. Sayreville Police officers and district campus security monitors, who will be equipped with metal detection wands, will be stationed at each gate to screen spectators and enforce these procedures.



In <u>107</u> days, residents in Sayreville will have the opportunity to *Cool the Schools* when they vote on the **Facilities Improvement Bond Referendum**, which is scheduled to be voted on by the Sayreville community on <u>October 4, 2022</u>. Please remember that next year the school district will continue to provide subscription busing for students who live within **2.0 miles** from the **middle school** and **2.5 miles** from the **high school**. The cost per student will be \$495 for the school year, but students who are eligible for <u>free or reduced lunch</u> will ride at **no cost**. However, students who **owe money** to the district for any reason, including for unpaid meals during the 2019-20 and previous school years, will **not** be eligible to receive the service

until their debts are <u>paid in full</u>. While we will do our best to accommodate all applicants, we will prioritize seats for those students who live the furthest from their respective school. Over the weekend, it was reported to us that that two individuals from SUES, one from the middle school, one from the Truman School, one from the Selover School, and one from the Buildings and Grounds Department have tested positive for COVID-19. After conducting contact tracing in accordance with New Jersey Department of Health (NJDOH) guidelines, no individuals were determined to be in "close contact" with the infected people. Due to the recent surge in COVID-19 cases, we <u>encourage</u> staff and students to <u>wear masks</u> while in our <u>school</u> <u>buildings</u>. We also continue to request that parents:

- Do not send their child(ren) to school if they are symptomatic.
- Report to the administration and nurses at their child(ren)'s respective school(s) if their child(ren) are symptomatic, have tested positive, or were in close contact with an infected individual outside of school.
- Remind their child(ren) to practice appropriate hand hygiene
- Strongly consider participating in the school district's testing and vaccination programs.

Please remember that the Parlin Pharmacy is graciously offering all Sayreville Public Schools staff, students and family members COVID-19 home rapid test kits for no or little out of pocket cost. While most insurances cover home rapid test kits at no cost, unfortunately we have learned that there are certain insurances which may not.



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However, if your insurance policy does not cover them, the pharmacy is offering our staff, students and family members a special price of \$9.99 per kit. Furthermore, while some policies may not immediately cover the cost of the kit, they may provide full reimbursement upon the submission of a receipt, which will be provided by the pharmacy. Please also remember that this Wednesday, June 22, 2022, and every Wednesday throughout the summer, we will continue to offer voluntary staff/family and student/family COVID-19 testing with Back to Work Solutions in the Sayreville War Memorial High School Cafeteria, but the time will change to 1:00 – 3:00 pm. Below, please find the tentative dates for this service throughout the summer. Please remember that we do not test people who are demonstrating symptoms Therefore, if you are symptomatic, you should ask your healthcare provider for an appropriate testing location. If you are a staff member or the parent of a student who is interested in learning more information about how you and your residing family members can participate in this vital virus spreading prevention activity, click here. Please note that if you have already participated in testing with us, you only need to conduct a telemedicine appointment. If you have never tested with us in the past, you would need to register using the following link https://backtoworksolutions.com/SayervillePSD.html. Once you have conducted your telemedicine appointment, you will receive a prescription for the PCR test, which you must bring to testing. Unfortunately, for safety purposes, no "walk-ins" will be permitted into the school. In fact, with in-district COVID-19 testing, all registered participants must report to Door 22 of the high school cafeteria (adjacent to the dumpsters), where they will be screened by our security team before being allowed into the vaccination room. Back by popular demand, parents can now send their children to Camp XL with busing. After a two-year hiatus, this summer the district will be once again accepting tuition students in preschool through 8th grade to attend Camp XL, our popular integrated extended school year academic camp, which will take place this summer from July 5 until August 4, 2022. It will be located at the Samsel Upper Elementary School and Cheesequake School and will be open four days per week from 8 am to 12 pm. Click here to learn more about Camp XL. In addition, the district will be partnering with New Jersey STEM to provide our students with an exciting weekly series of science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics (STEAM) learning opportunities for students aged 5-13. In fact, during the first week, which will be called Sayreville Summer STEAM, Sayreville Public Schools students can attend at a discounted rate of S50 for the entire week (Students eligible for reduced lunch will pay \$25 and those eligible for free lunch will attend for free lowever, each subsequent week, students can

participate for a very affordable cost of \$100 per week. The program will run concurrently with Camp XL from July 5 until August 4, 2022, will be located at the Samsel Upper Elementary School, and will be open four days per week from 12:00 pm to 4:30 pm.
