# What is Dual Enrollment?

Dual Enrollment is authorized under [Florida Statute 1007.271](#) as an articulated acceleration mechanism. It is intended to shorten the time necessary for students to complete the requirements associated with the conference of a high school diploma and college degree, broaden the scope of curricular options available to students, and increase the depth of study available for a particular subject.

The dual enrollment program is the enrollment of an eligible secondary student or home education student in a postsecondary course creditable toward high school completion and a career certificate or an associate or baccalaureate degree. A student who is enrolled in postsecondary instruction that is not creditable toward a high school diploma may not be classified as a dual enrollment student.

# What does this mean?



Student earn high school credit and college credit at the same time.

ENC 1101, Intro to Composition, will give a student 3 college credits in Communications and 1 high school English credit.



Students start their college GPA/transcript with their first Dual Enrollment course.

This is a big deal! It can affect financial aid, transferring to another college, eligibility for scholarships, and acceptance into graduate school.

# Eligibility for Dual Enrollment

Students must:

- be in 6-12 grade \*
- have the required high school GPA\*
- have qualifying score of either the SAT, ACT, PERT or TABE test\*
- maintain positive attendance patterns
- lack recent discipline problems

\* Varies between programs and courses

# Dual Enrollment with University of Florida

- Eligible students gain access to UF courses delivered 100% online.
- Satisfy general education requirements and/or explore new subject areas through challenging electives.
- Take up to two courses each fall and spring semester at no cost.
- Courses:
  - Vary term to term
  - Cover a wide range of subject areas
  - Provide a rigorous collegiate experience

# Criteria for University of Florida

- Must be a rising Junior or Senior
- 3.6 cumulative unweighted GPA
- Qualifying test scores
  - SAT: 1100
  - PSAT 10/NMSQT: 1130
  - ACT: 22
- Application for Fall is closed, Spring registration information will be available in September with your school counselor.

# Dual Enrollment with Embry Riddle Aeronautical University

## Engineering Scholars Program at Embry-Riddle (ESPER)

- The ESPER Program at ERAU is a seven-week summer scholar's program for 20 Volusia County high school students.
- ESPER provides students with the opportunity to enroll in several first-year engineering courses.
- Upon successful completion of the program, students will earn two to five semester credit hours from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University and one weighted elective credit from their home high school.
  - EGR 101—Introduction to Engineering (2 credit hours) and one of the two following courses:
    - EGR 115—Introduction to Computing for Engineers (3 credit hours) or
    - EGR 120—Graphical Communications (3 credit hours)



# Dual Enrollment with Embry Riddle Aeronautical University

- Technology, Engineering, Science & Aeronautics (TESA) at Atlantic High School
  - Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University offers select high schools in the area the opportunity to earn college credit while attending high school.
  - The goal as an academy is to help students prepare for careers in the growing aerospace industry by offering hands-on activities, real world experiences, and field trips in the aerospace and aviation industry

# Criteria for Embry Riddle Aeronautical University

## • ESPER:

- Be a rising senior (summer between the junior and senior year)
- 3.0 unweighted GPA
- Completed Mathematical Analysis or higher
- Minimum Test scores on SAT or ACT
  - SAT: Reading 440 Math 440
  - ACT: Reading 18 Writing 17 Math 21
  - PERT: Reading 104 Writing 99 Math 113
- Complete application packet
- Letter of recommendation from your principal
- Application closed, will open in March, see your school counselor

## • TESA

- Must be a rising 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, or 11<sup>th</sup> grader to Apply for any Career Academy.
- Application opens in December every year

# Criteria for with Daytona State College

## Vocational Programs:

- GPA: Minimum of 2.0 High School GPA
- Testing criteria:
  - TABE score requirements vary depending on the program.
  - Students must take the test prior to enrolling in a vocational program but may begin without meeting the exit scores.
  - Students must pass the TABE with the required exit score to be eligible to earn their certification.
- Some programs require the student to be 16 years old.

# Steps to Dual Enroll with Daytona State College

## 1. Confirm Eligibility

- Talk to your school counselor to verify GPA, eligibility, high school graduation requirements, and college readiness.

## 2. Apply to DSC using the [How to Apply Guide](#)

- Choose "Dual Enroll" as your Academic Plan.

## 3. Placement Testing

- Visit any DSC Assessment Office for placement testing. Already have test scores? Submit them with your [Dual Enrollment Form](#).

## 4. New Student Advising

- [Schedule your virtual group new student advising session](#) for an overview of the programs offered, how to select courses, important dates, dual enrollment guidelines, and your [Dual Enrollment Form](#).

## 5. Complete your [Dual Enrollment Form](#)

- Then connect with your school counselor to review your course selections, verify GPA, and sign off on the form.

# Dual Enrolling with Daytona State College

## Things to Consider

- Dual enrolled students are limited to **2** fully online courses per 15-week semester, with the exception of students who have earned at least 30 credits and have a minimum 3.5 DSC GPA.
- All courses taken at DSC will become a part of the student's permanent college and high school transcript.
- Course materials and class discussions may involve mature topics not typically included in secondary courses. Courses are not modified to accommodate variations in student age and maturity.
- New Students can only enroll in Fall or Spring Semester.

# Earn College Credit through High School CTE Courses

To earn the articulated college credit, students must provide the following documentation to the college and be enrolled in the program identified:

- High School transcript noting:
  - Completion of high school CTE courses AND
  - Cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- A copy of the Industry Certification earned (when applicable)
- List of courses that articulate to the college.



# Earn College Credit through High School Advanced Courses

- Students can take AP, IB, and Cambridge courses at their high school.
- Must earn a passing score on the exam associated with course.
- Their college GPA will not be impacted.
- College credit is awarded based on post secondary institute and scores
- The FLDOE has outlined the minimum credit that instate public institution must grant a student for passing an exam.
- College Board has a more complete list for passing an AP exam.
