Wingate University's Master of Accounting Program ("MAC") has been serving Charlotte area professionals since 2010. The MAC Program is located in the Neu Building on the Wingate Main Campus in Wingate, NC. Classes are offered during weekday evenings (Monday-Thursday) that commence each fall (August), spring (January), and summer (May) and combine superior academic quality with affordable tuition. Our MAC courses are offered via remote-live-online and in-person delivery based on student preference (ie. students may elect to take classes remote-live-online, in-person, or a combination of both remote-live-online and in-person at their discretion). Our MAC students typically have close to 100% job placement following completion of all degree requirements.

MAC Curriculum

- The MAC curriculum consists of 30 credits which includes 10 three-credit courses
- Classes are delivered face-to-face or live-online based on student choice
- Fulfills the 150 credit hour requirement and prepares students to sit for the CPA exam
- A real-world curriculum taught by accounting faculty who combine an academic and practitioner oriented experience

Required Undergraduate Accounting Prerequisite Courses

- Principles of Financial and Managerial Accounting
- Intermediate Accounting I & II
- Federal Income Tax Accounting
- Auditing
- Principles of Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Finance, Marketing, Management, Business Statistics, and Mathematics (College Algebra or Calculus)

Course Sequence

- Students may commence the program during the fall, spring, or summer semester
- Classes are offered during weekday evenings beginning at 6:00 p.m. during the fall, spring, and summer
- The part-time sequence includes two classes in the fall and spring semesters (two nights per week), one or two classes in the summer, and is completed in under two years
- The full-time sequence includes four classes in the fall and spring semesters (four nights per week), one or two classes in the summer, and is completed in just one year

Tuition*

\$695 per MAC credit hour \$2,085 per MAC course

\$20,850 total program cost (10 courses x \$2,025 per course)

*Effective for the <u>2025-2026</u> academic year. There is typically a tuition increase each academic year, effective with the Summer semester.

For students who receive assistance through their company's tuition reimbursement program, tuition payments are deferred until the end of each semester, which can save out-of-pocket expenses.
