



Annual Report for the 2021/2022 Academic Year

Changchun American International School is proud of our collective achievements and the hard work of our students, parents, staff, and teachers. The following is a summary of achievements, initiatives, and progress for the 2021-2022 academic year, and an overview of the strategic plans for the 2022-2023 academic year.

Between March 9 and June 9, 2022, our students and staff experienced a resurgence of the Covid-19 pandemic in our area. This resulted in severe lock down and quarantine conditions and online learning for our students. Our staff prepared for this eventuality, and we quickly shifted to online education using our online platforms: Toddle (Primary), ManageBac (Secondary), and Zhumu. In our efforts to deliver the best possible service to our students and parents, we conducted an online education satisfaction survey. The results of the survey are summarized below:


Comments from Secondary Parents:

My son is engaged and participates in all lessons. Teachers are prepared and available each class. He likes to see his friends and is excited to get back to school in person.



The Council of International Schools (CIS)

The Council of International Schools (CIS) is a membership community committed to high quality international education. The CIS community includes more than 1300 schools and universities, representing 123 countries. CAIS is currently a CIS Member having met membership requirements in 2020. CAIS is simultaneously applying for accreditation by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). WASC accepts the CIS self-study protocol for the WASC accreditation.

CAIS is currently in the final stage of the evaluation phase. We have submitted Part 1 and Domain A of the self-study to CIS in February 2022. We received feedback from CIS in March 2022. The entire self-study will be submitted to CIS in August 2022, and the verification visit will take place from October 15 to October 21, 2022. Both CIS and WASC accreditations are expected after the visit.

The Physics Bowl is a Physics contest held annually by the American Association of Physics Teachers (AAPT), which has a history of 30 years. It is the most well-known high school Physics competition in the US, which involves more than 10,000 students each year. The Physics Bowl is recognized by many elite universities across the globe.


2022 Math Kangaroo Competition
