Dr. Ernest E. Moore, Jr. (Class of 1964)



Recognized internationally as a leading authority on trauma surgery, Dr. Moore serves as chief of surgery at Denver General Hospital and as a professor and vice chairman of surgery at the University of Colorado Health Services Center. He has received the outstanding surgical faculty award at the University of Colorado, has served as President of the American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, and President of Colorado Trauma Institute, and has lectured internationally at universities and medical conferences.

Dr. Moore was selected as one of Denver's top doctors, named more often than any other specialist in a survey of Denver area physicians. Dr. Moore has secured more than 25 grants from leading research laboratories, often serving as principal investigator for research projects on cancer, heart, emergency care, and trauma injuries. In 1990, he appeared in a CBS production of Rescue 911. Dr. Moore has edited and contributed to five textbooks on trauma injuries, including Trauma, one of the leading textbooks on the subject.

Dr. Moore received his bachelor of science degree in chemistry from Allegheny College and 1968 and his medical degree from the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine in 1972. A resident of Denver, he attended Oakland Township Elementary School. His father is a Butler doctor.
