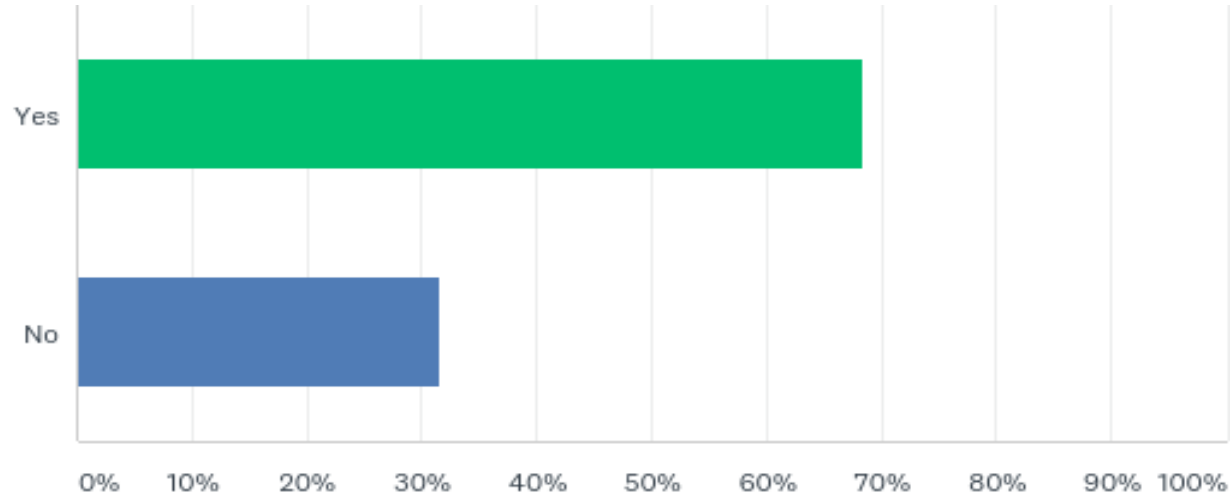

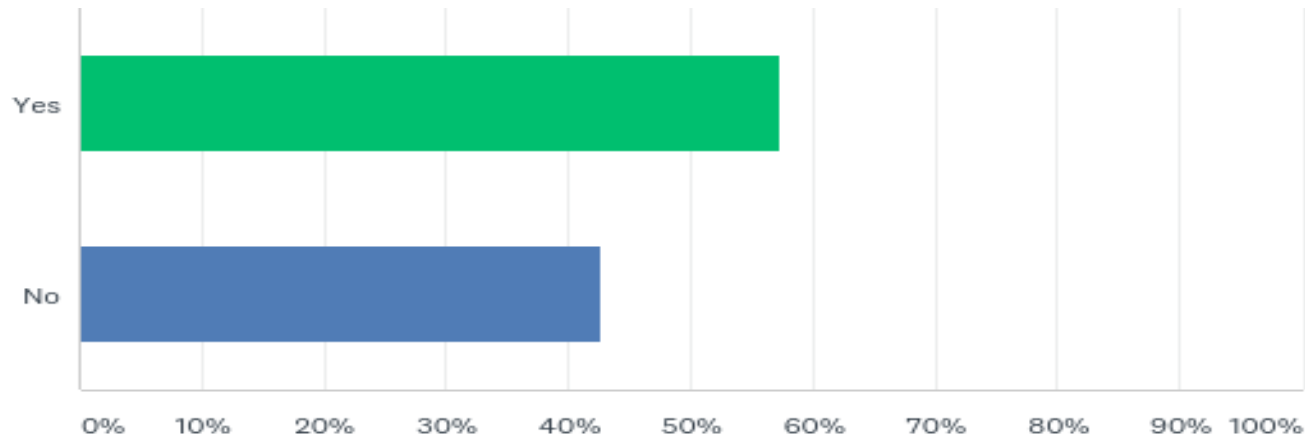
Q1: Do you reside in Sayreville?

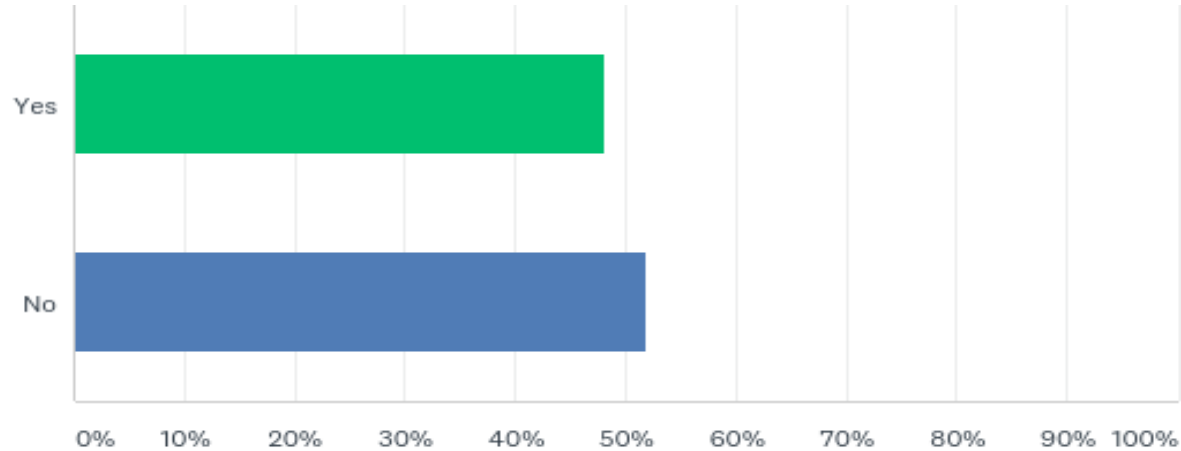

Q3: Do you work in the Sayreville Public Schools?

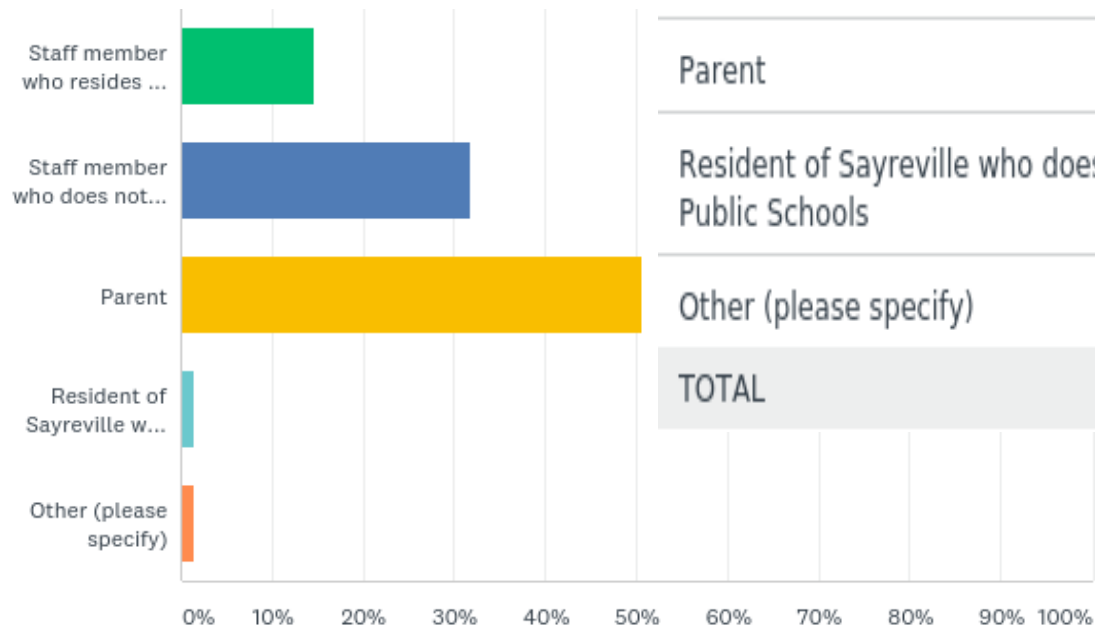

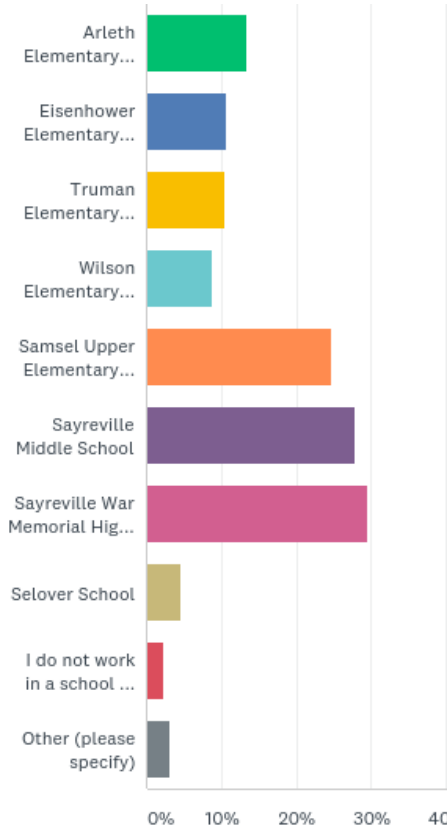

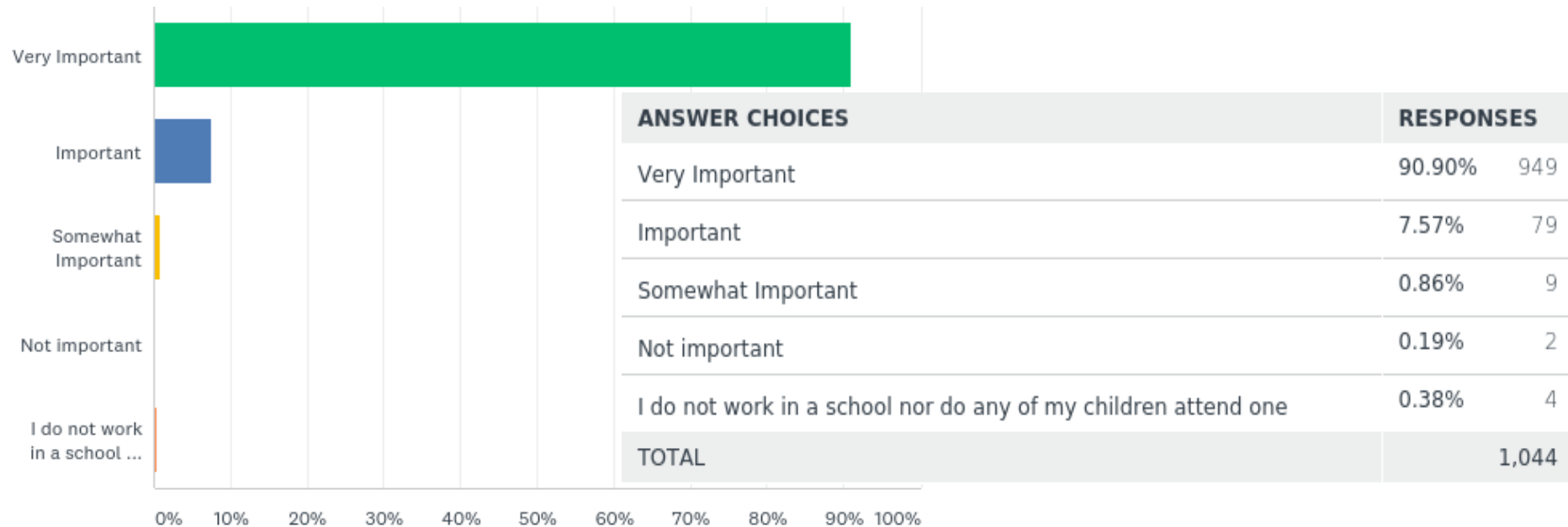

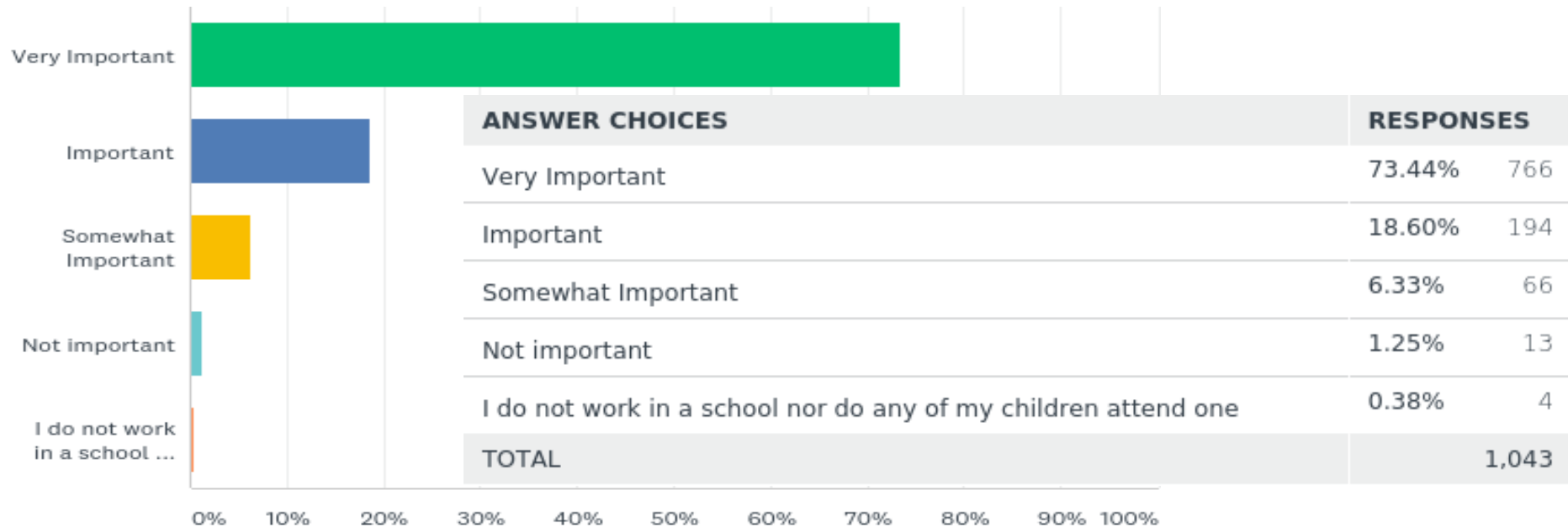
Q6: How much do you value the safety of the school building(s) that your child(ren) learn in or you work in?

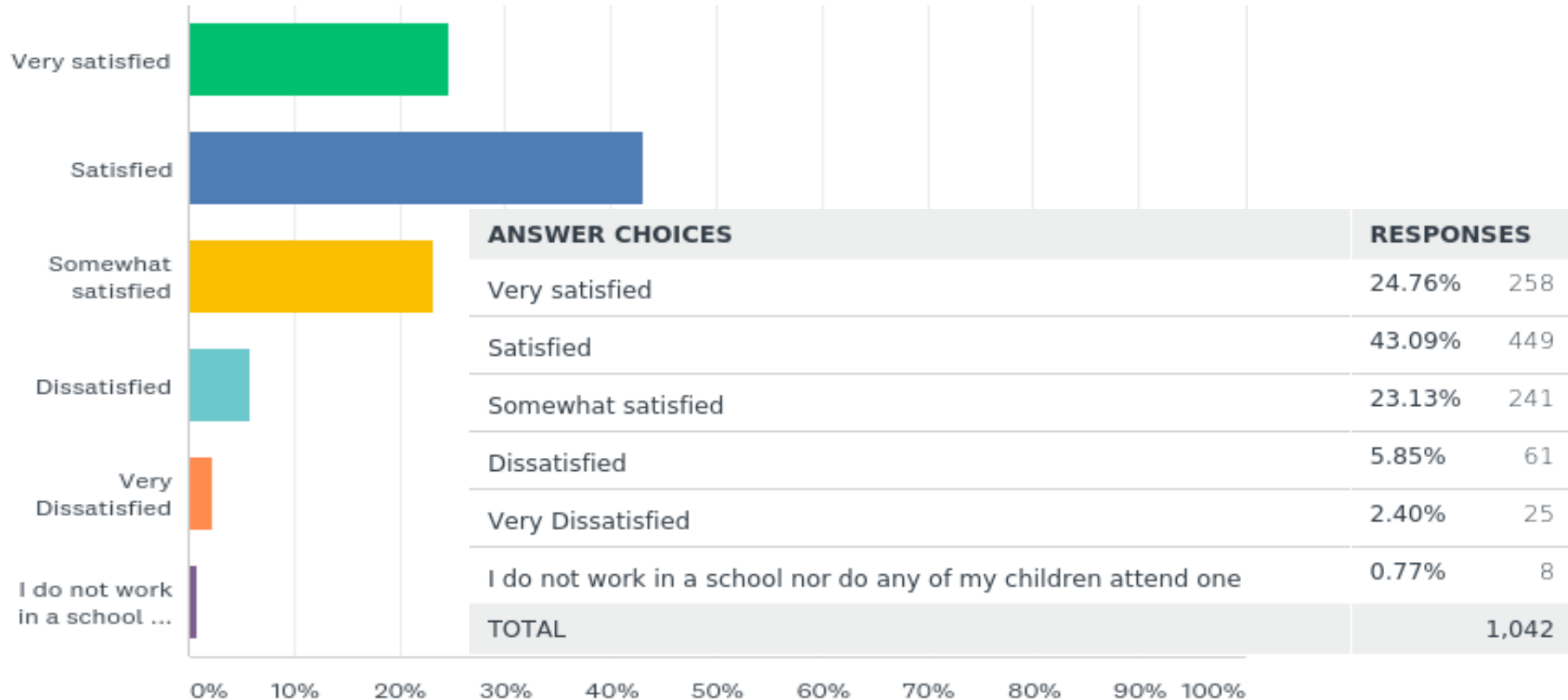
Q7: How important is the climate or temperature in the school building(s) that your child(ren) learn in or you work in?

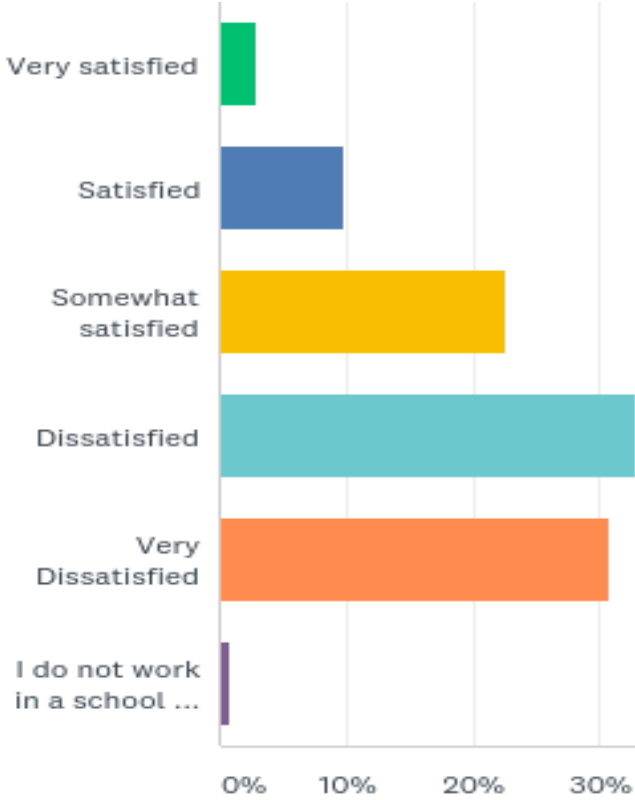
Q8: How satisfied are you with the safety of the school building(s) that your child(ren) learn in or you work in?

Q9: How satisfied are you with the climate or temperature in the school building(s) that your child(ren) learn in or you work in, especially during the months of May, June, September, and October?

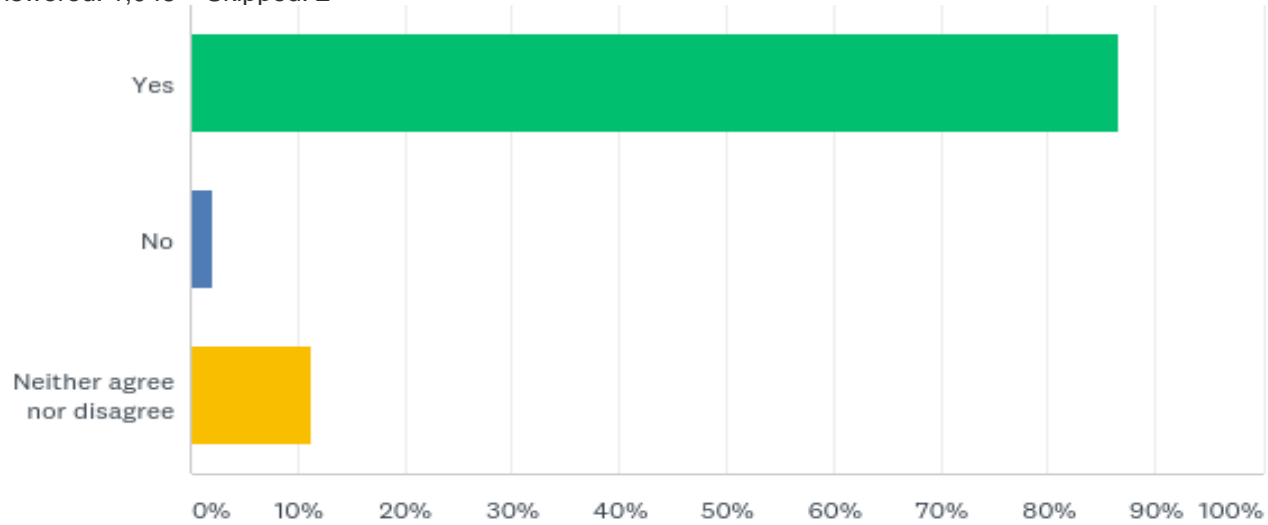

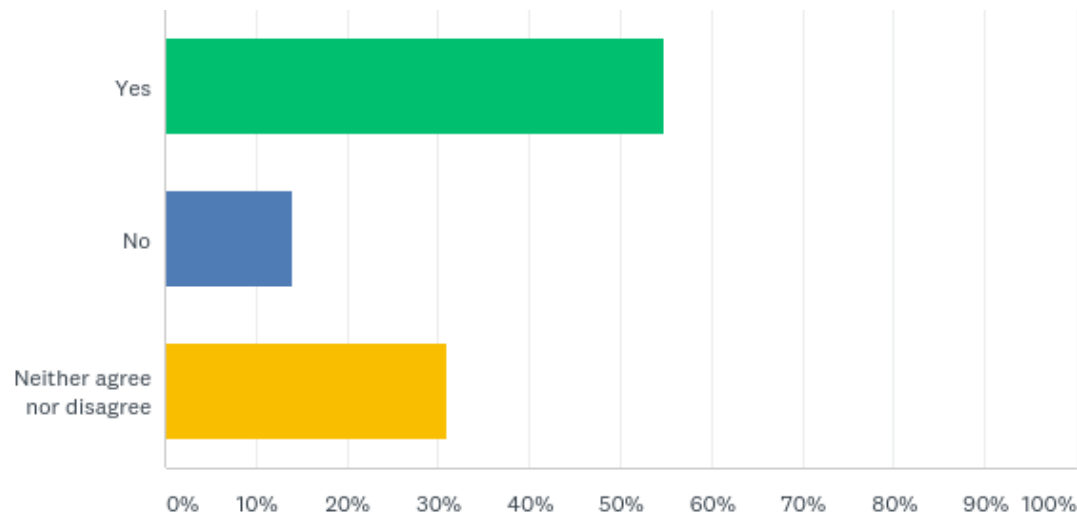

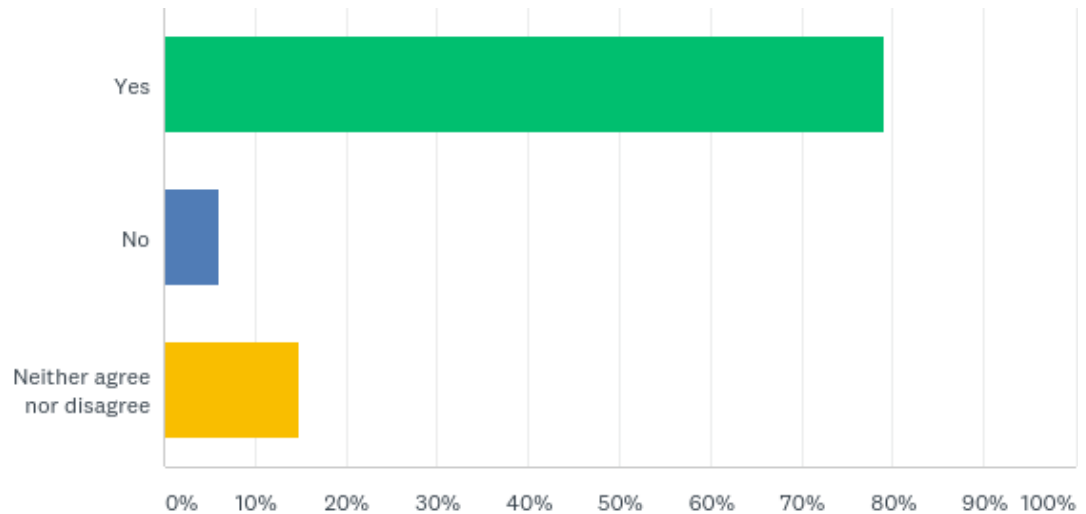

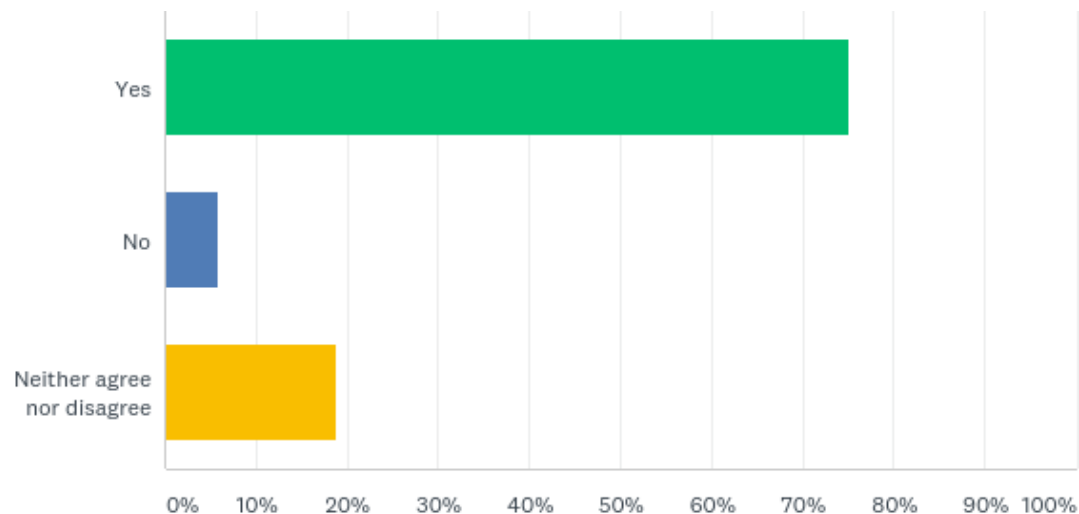

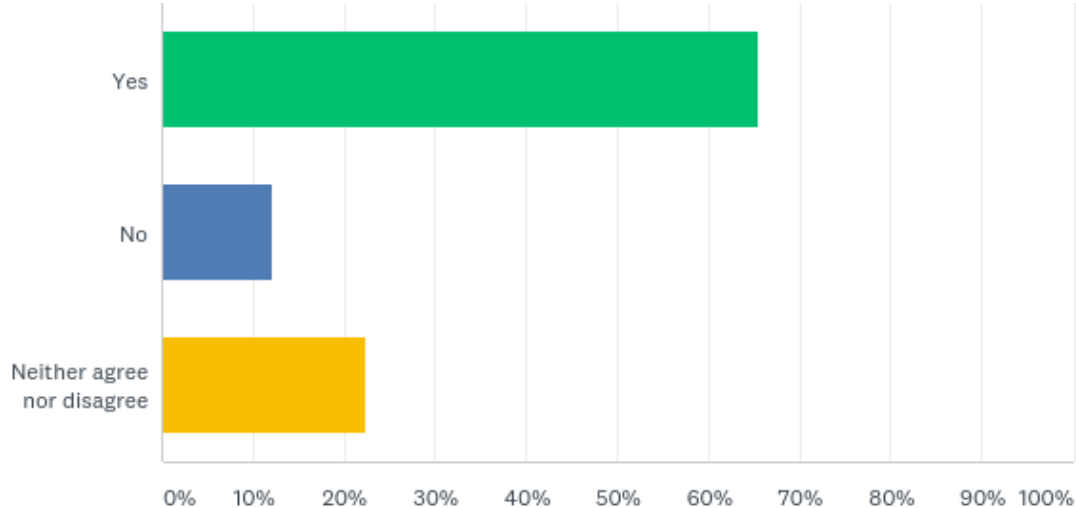

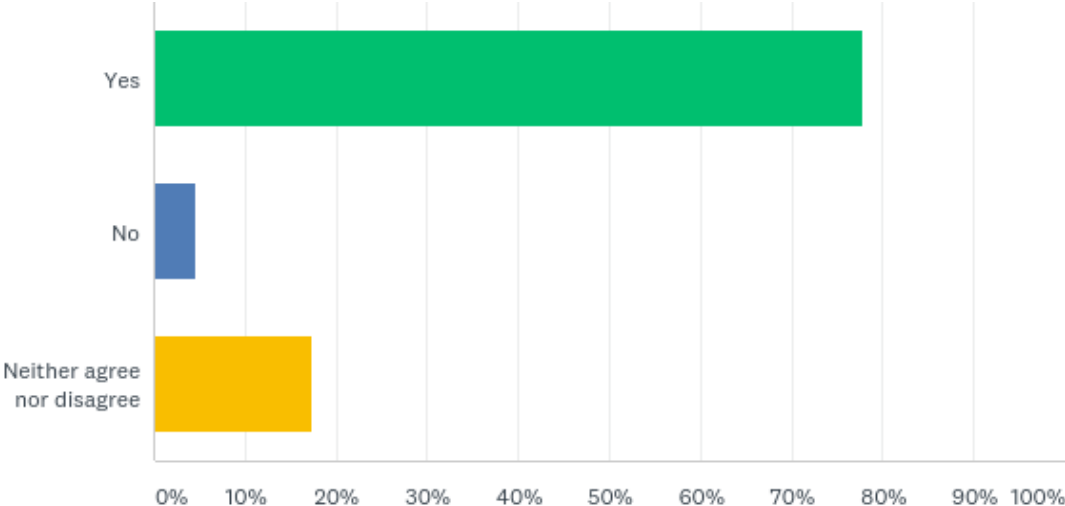

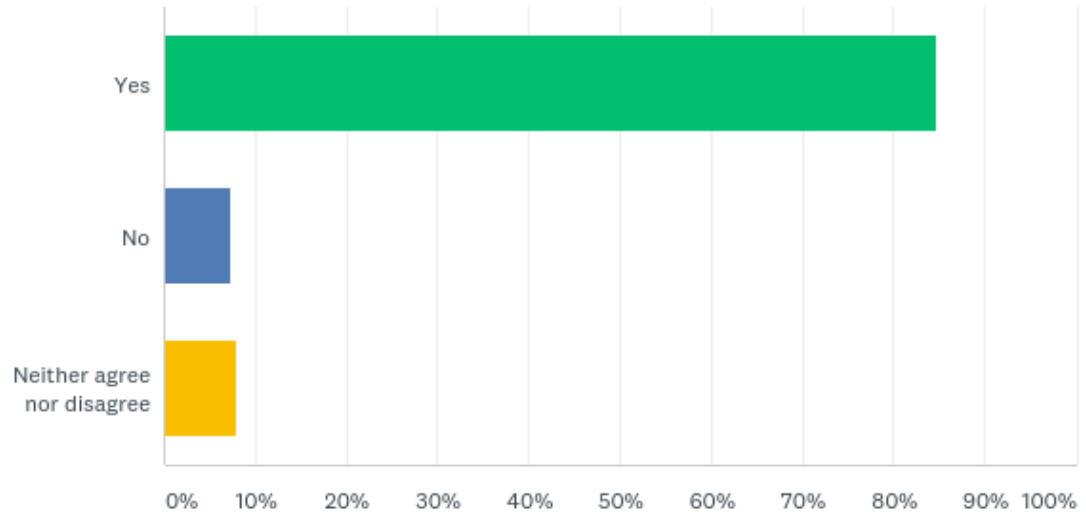

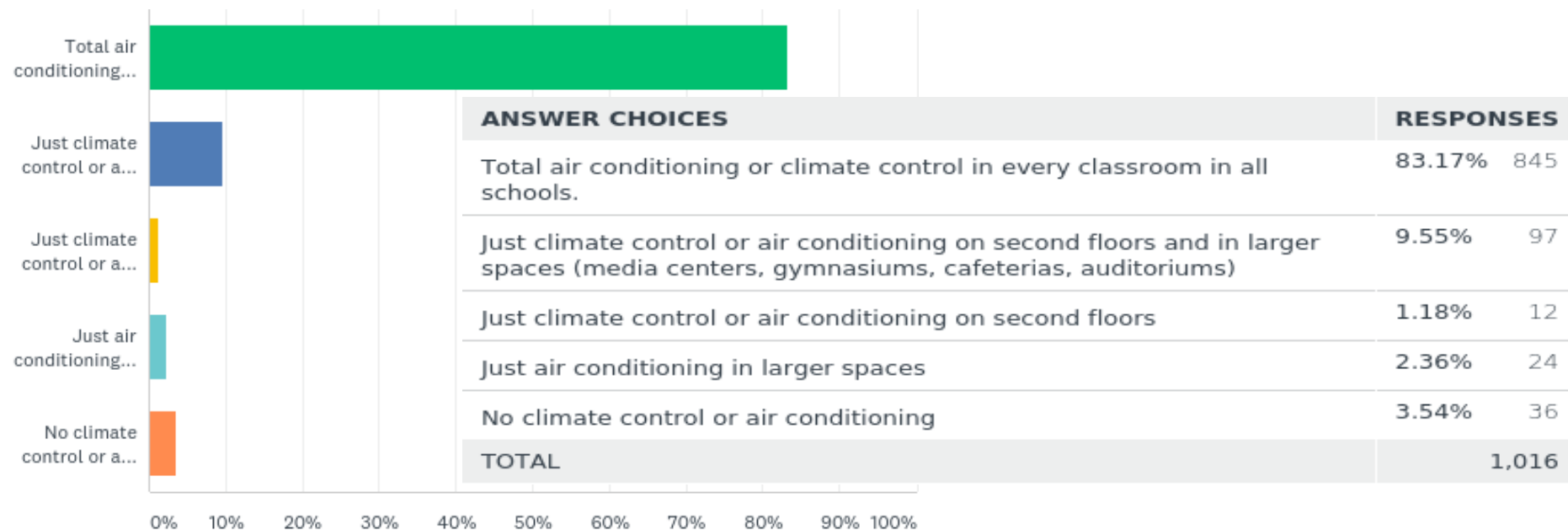

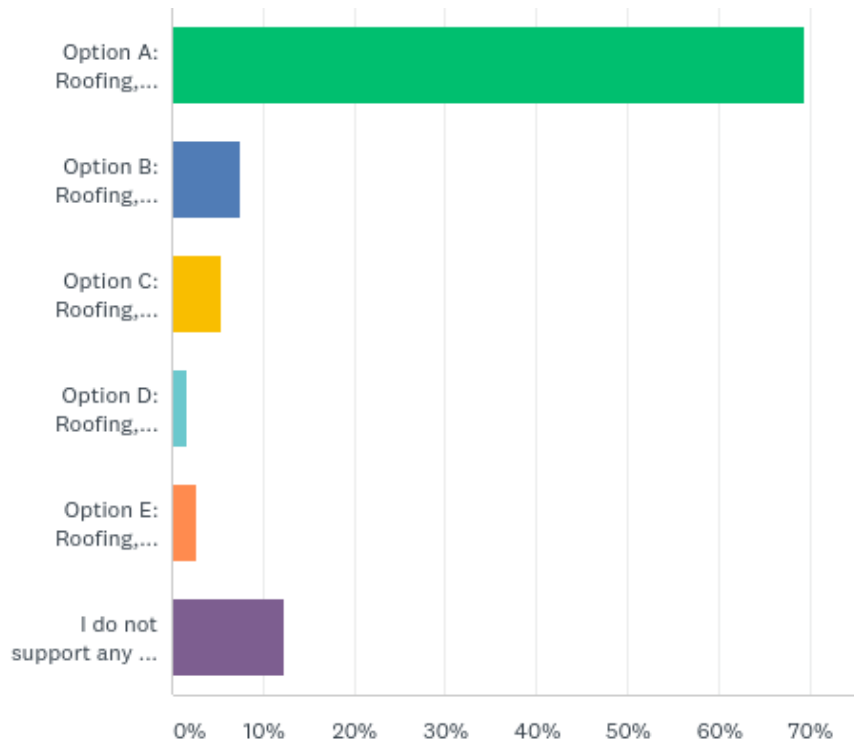

Option A: Roofing, windows, upgrades to HV/AC in all classrooms in each school, HVAC for larger spaces, HV/AC to upper floors, & renovation of the Selover School at a cost of approximately \$99.7 million with an estimated tax impact of \$295 annually for the AVG assessed home in Sayreville (\$144,724).	69.46% 712
Option B: Roofing, windows, upgrades to HV/AC in all classrooms in the Arleth, Eisenhower, and Truman Schools, HVAC for larger spaces, HV/AC to upper floors, & renovation of the Selover School at a cost of approximately \$71.7 million with an estimated tax impact of \$212 annually for the AVG assessed home in Sayreville (\$144,724).	7.51% 77
Option C: Roofing, windows, HVAC for larger spaces, HV/AC to upper floors, & renovation of the Selover School at a cost of approximately \$54.8 million with an estimated tax impact of \$162 annually for the AVG assessed home in Sayreville (\$144,724).	5.46% 56
Option D: Roofing, windows, HVAC for larger spaces, & renovation of Selover School at a cost of approximately \$38.3 million with an estimated tax impact of \$112 annually for the AVG assessed home in Sayreville (\$144,724).	1.66% 17
Option E: Roofing, windows, & renovation of the Selover School at a cost of approximately \$27.7 million with an estimated tax impact of \$82 annually for the AVG assessed home in Sayreville (\$144,724).	2.73% 28
