During an Annual Preventive Office Visit, you'll receive services such as:

- Tests and Screenings
- Vaccinations
- Healthy Habit Counseling

Non-Preventive Services

Some Costs May Apply

Visits to address chronic or pre-existing conditions such as:

- Diabetes
- Heart Problems
- Arthritis
- Depression
- COPD

Annual Preventive Office Visit

All ages

If other health problems are present and addressed at your Annual Preventive Office Visit (e.g., a sore throat), you may be billed for an office visit

Annual Breast Cancer Screening

Age 40 and over

If you are under age 40

Annual Cervical Cancer Screening

Ages 21–29 pap smear every 3 years or, if ages 30–64, pap smear with HPV co-test every 5 years

Follow-up visits if cervical cancer cells are found

Annual Cholesterol Screening

All ages

Additional visits to monitor and control cholesterol levels

One Colonoscopy Every 5 Years

Age 50–75

Additional screenings

Annual Depression Screening

Adults and adolescents

Visits to mental health specialists

Vaccines

Doses and age-specific vaccines vary

Vaccines for travel outside the U.S.

Annual Chlamydia, Gonorrhea and Syphilis Screening

Ages 15–65
