Be Affecting Your Child's

EDUCATION?



Specific Learning Disabilities

A disorder in processing or using information that affects reading, math, written expression, oral expression, and/or listening comprehension or causes severe underachievement in academic work.

Emotional or Behavioral Disorders

Problems with behavior, social skills, peer relations, emotional responses, and coping skills which interfere with learning and/or relationships in school.

Speech or Language Impairments

Significant difficulty speaking, understanding, or using words and sentences in a meaningful way.

Developmental Cognitive Disabilities

Observable delay in reaching developmental milestones, difficulty in activities of daily living and a slower rate of learning.

Deaf or Hard of Hearing

Hearing loss that interferes with the learner's performance in school.

Visual Impairments

Loss of vision, visual field cut and/or very poor visual acuity even with correction (glasses), that interfere with performance in school.

Physical Impairments

Permanent acute or chronic physical conditions that interfere with performance in school.

Autism Spectrum Disorders

Neurodevelopmental disorders affect how children process information and see the world. ASD can impact a child's social relationships, communication skills and behaviors in different ways and to different degrees.

Traumatic Brain Injuries

Permanent and severe injury to the brain occurring after birth that interferes with learning.

Other Health Disabilities

Medically diagnosed chronic or acute health conditions that greatly interfere with learning.

EARLY CHILDHOOD SPECIAL EDUCATION (ECSE)

Children from birth to age 7 who have a delay or disorder in development or have an identifiable sensory, physical, mental, or social-emotional condition known to interfere with normal development.

Children may receive one service or multiple services related to their needs in home, in day care settings, or in educational programs designed primarily for children with disabilities. Decisions on where services will be provided are based on the child's needs.
