Board Chair Ritcheson officially called to order the Annual Budget Meeting for Regional School Unit No. 5 at 6:34 PM.

Pledge of Allegiance

ARTICLE 1A: To elect a moderator to preside at the meeting.

Board Chair Ritcheson nominated Mr. Gregory Im as Moderator. Board member Beth Munsen seconded this nomination. No further nominations occurred, and Mr. Im was elected by unanimous vote. Superintendent Foley swore in Mr. Im.

Mr. Im welcomed everyone and explained the following:

- All ballot clerks were previously sworn in.
- Must be a registered voter to vote. Check in with the ballot clerk.
- The Maine Moderators Manual will be used as a procedural guideline.

ARTICLE 12: To see what sum the Regional School Unit will appropriate for the total cost of funding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and to see what sum the Regional School Unit will raise and assess as each municipality's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688.

Explanation: The Regional School Unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act is the amount of money determined by state law to be the minimum amount that the Regional School Unit must raise and assess in order to receive the full amount of state dollars. t [Note: The above appropriations are determined in accordance with the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15688(1); the amounts to be raised reflect the required local contribution in accordance with the RSU Reorganization Plan.]

ARTICLE 13: To see what sum the Regional School Unit will raise and appropriate for the annual payments on debt service previously approved by the Regional School Unit voters for non-state-funded school construction projects or non-state-funded portions of school construction projects in addition to the funds appropriated as the local share of the Regional School Unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from kindergarten to grade 12.
School Board Recommends \$125,094.00

Explanation: Non-state-funded debt service is the amount of money needed for the annual payments on the Regional School Unit's long-term debt for major capital school construction projects that are not approved for state subsidy. The bonding of this long-term debt was previously approved by the Regional School Unit voters.

ARTICLE 14: (Written ballot required.) To see what sum the Regional School Unit will raise and appropriate in additional local funds, which exceeds the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model.

The School Board Recommends \$10,857,453.64 in additional local funds, which will cause the total school budget to exceed the State's Essential Programs and Services allocation model by \$12,134,478 as required to fund the budget recommended by the School Board. The School Board gives the following reasons for exceeding the State's Essential Programs and Services funding model: The State's Essential Program and Services funding formula is a minimum model to support education in grades preK-12. RSU No. 5 provides additional funds to support lower student/teacher ratios and additional co-curricular activities in addition to complete educational programs for all our students.

Explanation: The additional local funds are those locally raised funds over and above the Regional School Unit's local contribution to the total cost of fielding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act and local amounts raised for the annual payment on non-state funded debt service that will help achieve the Regional School Unit budget for educational programs.

[Note: The additional local funds reflect the adjustment to the required local contribution in Article 12 in accordance with the RSU Reorganization Plan.]

ARTICLE 15 SUMMARIZES THE PROPOSED SCHOOL BUDGET

ARTICLE 15: To see what sum the Regional School Unit will authorize the School Board to expend for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022 and ending June 30, 2023 from the Regional School Unit's contribution to the total cost of funding public education from pre-kindergarten to grade 12 as described in the Essential Programs and Services Funding Act, non-state-funded school construction projects, additional local funds for school purposes under the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 20-A, section 15690, unexpended balances, tuition receipts, state subsidy and other receipts for the support of schools.

ARTICLE 16: To see if the Regional School Unit will appropriate \$234,700.00 for adult education and raise \$112,000.00 as the local share, with authorization to expend any additional, incidental, or miscellaneous receipts in the interest and for the well-being of the adult education program.

ARTICLE 17 AUTHORIZES TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO TRACK AND FIELD CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

ARTICLE 17: Shall the School Board be authorized to transfer up to \$35,000.00 from available fund balances to the Track and Field Capital Reserve Fund; and to expend said reserve funds upon express authorization of the RSU voters or as permitted by law?

ARTICLE 18 AUTHORIZES ESTABLISHMENT OF AND TRANSFERS OF FUNDS TO A TENNIS COURT CAPITAL RESERVE FUND

ARTICLE 18: Shall the School Board be authorized to establish a Tennis Court Capital Reserve Fund for upkeep and maintenance of the tennis courts at Freeport High School; to transfer \$30,000.00 to the Tennis Court Capital Reserve Fund from funds already appropriated for this purpose in the 2021-2022 fiscal year; to appropriate \$40,000.00 to transfer to the Tennis Court Capital Reserve Fund; and to expend said reserve funds upon express authorization of the RSU voters or as permitted by law?

ARTICLE 19 TRANSFERS FUNDS FROM CAPITAL RESERVE TO THE FUEL COST STABILIZATION FUND

ARTICLE 19: Shall the School Board be authorized to transfer up to **\$150,000.00**, as needed, to the fuel cost stabilization fund from the Capital Reserve Fund?

Statutory Disclosure Statement relating to Fuel Cost Stabilization Fund:
The fuel cost stabilization fund balance is currently \$100,000.00. If this article is approved as written, the fuel cost stabilization fund balance may be increased to \$250,000.00. ARTICLE 21 AUTHORIZES EXPENDITURES OF GRANTS AND OTHER RECEIPT

ARTICLE 21: In addition to amounts approved in the preceding articles, shall the School Board be authorized to expend such other sums as may be received from federal or state grants or programs or other sources during the fiscal year for school and other program purposes, provided that such grants, programs, or other sources do not require the expenditure of other funds not previously appropriated?

ARTICLE 22 AUTHORIZES TRANSFERS OF APPROPRIATIONS AMONG COST CENTERS

ARTICLE 22: Shall the School Board of Regional School Unit No. 5 be authorized to transfer amounts exceeding 5% of the total appropriation for any cost center to another cost center or among other cost centers for the 2022-2023 fiscal year, provided that transfers shall not be permitted to increase the authorized total school budget?

ARTICLE 23 AUTHORIZES THE DISPOSITION OF ANY ADDITIONAL STATE SUBSIDY RECEIVED

ARTICLE 23: In the event that the Regional School Unit receives more state education subsidy than the amount included in its budget, shall the School Board be authorized to use all or part of the additional state subsidy to increase expenditures for school purposes in cost center categories approved by the School Board, increase the allocation of finances in a reserve fund approved by the School Board, and/or decrease the local cost share expectation, as defined in Title 20-A, section 15671-A(1)(B), for local property taxpayers for funding public education as approved by the School Board?
