Addressing the Limitations and Congestion of a School Built Nearly 50 Years Ago

Over the next 10 years, more than 3,500 potential new K-12 students are expected to move into the district. Current projections show that 15 schools will be over capacity and we will have a deficit of nearly 2,500 K-12 seats for students by 2031 if we do nothing.

If Approved by Voters:

- · Construction of a new classroom addition
- Construction of a new cafeteria and kitchen
- Renovation and expansion Career and Technical Education (CTE) and Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM), including robotics space
- Construction of new secure front entry and student services area

- Creation of a multipurpose space for online learning
- Building redesign and renovation to reduce hallway crowding and increase building flow
- Complete site redesign to improve traffic flow and increased pedestrian safety
- Student capacity would increase to approximately 2,250
