Jennifer Moore -Finance Committee Report:

- Review of Income Statement/Balance Sheet for May 31, 2022
- The Board also reviewed the budget for the year ending June 30, 2022
Mr. Hall motioned to approve the revised budgets. Ms. Strong seconded. All approved.
- The State is changing how the state revenues are determined and paid. It appears the budget for the 22 – 23 school year will be due to the state district September 1, 2022. We will have salary increases in our new budget for the 22-23 school year.

Principal Reports:

Kenesha Hardy – 4k Center

- Principal Hardy shared school updates:
 - Continue to strengthen community partnerships to support our families with: 100 weekend food bags, creating a lending library, signing up for the Dolly Parton Imagination Library, etc.
 - Continue to increase family involvement and build the school to home connection through: tours, home visits, newsletters, etc.
 - Currently completing end of year assessments
 - Planning for the July 13th Family Orientation

Eyvette Schrimmer – Elementary School

- Principal Schrimmer shared school updates:
 - Summer Academy 5k-4th is the highest enrollment so far in years -scholars completing 4 days a week for 5 weeks
 - Working on strengthening foundational reading skills and math skills
 - Planned a fun event through our Christ Church partnership -their Vacation Bible School joined the 5k last week for a Field Day
 - 3rd Grade Read to Succeed mandated summer attendance - Anticipating at least 50% of the current scholars to be promoted to the 4th grade
 - Currently preparing for 2022-2023 registration and the "Welcome Home Legacy Lion Week"
 - We are almost completely enrolled for next year already
 - Continuing to reach out to our families through: Smores messages, videos, orientation meetings, zoom evening meetings, etc.

Aimee Pierre - Middle School

- Principal Pierre shared school updates:
 - Summer Academy -currently has 85 scholars in regular attendance
 - One of our Legacy graduates is returning to Legacy and will serve as a 5th grade ELA teacher for 2022-2023!
 - Currently preparing for Bridge Day on July 27th for rising 5th graders to meet their teachers, learn where to go on the first day of school and where their classrooms are located in the buildings
 - The Middle School Dean of Culture and Parent Coordinator are currently working with families over the summer through: calling parents, collecting chromebooks, driving by houses, etc.

Aaron Ledford - High School

- Principal Ledford shared school updates:
 - Summer Academy -the goal is to have the number of scholars attending becomes smaller as the summer ends
 - Began with 77 scholars
 - So far 40 scholars have already covered at least one course
 - 8 have finished 2 courses
 - 4 super seniors are finishing requirements
 - 25 scholars are taking dual enrollment courses this summer
 - High School new Assistant Principals started this week -they already attended RELAY in Denver 2 weeks ago
 - The High School Dean of Culture and Parent Coordinator are currently calling parents, collecting chromebooks, driving by houses, etc. -this has really helped with early registration for next school year

Dr. LaCheryl Smith -Head of Schools Report:

- Dr. Smith shared details about:
 - High School graduation updates -4 scholars received Associates Degrees
 - This year, Legacy Graduates were offered over 7.4 million in scholarship money!
 - A Legacy Graduate from our 2021 graduating class, Brice McGowan, was drafted in the Charlotte Hornets this week
 - Legacy will continue to focus on scholar recruitment and teacher recruitment

Mr. William Brown - Board Chair Report:

- Mr. Brown shared:
 - Culture Building -how important it is for us to continue to build relationships with our families
 - Legacy will have more family events planned throughout next school year
 - RELAY Training continues for next year
 - 2 former Legacy scholar athletes are in the pros now
 - Discussion about Legacy’s continued focus on academics with all scholar athletes
 - Girls Basketball Ring Ceremony tonight in the Parker cafeteria
 - Discussion about current safety plans on all campuses and adjustments needed
