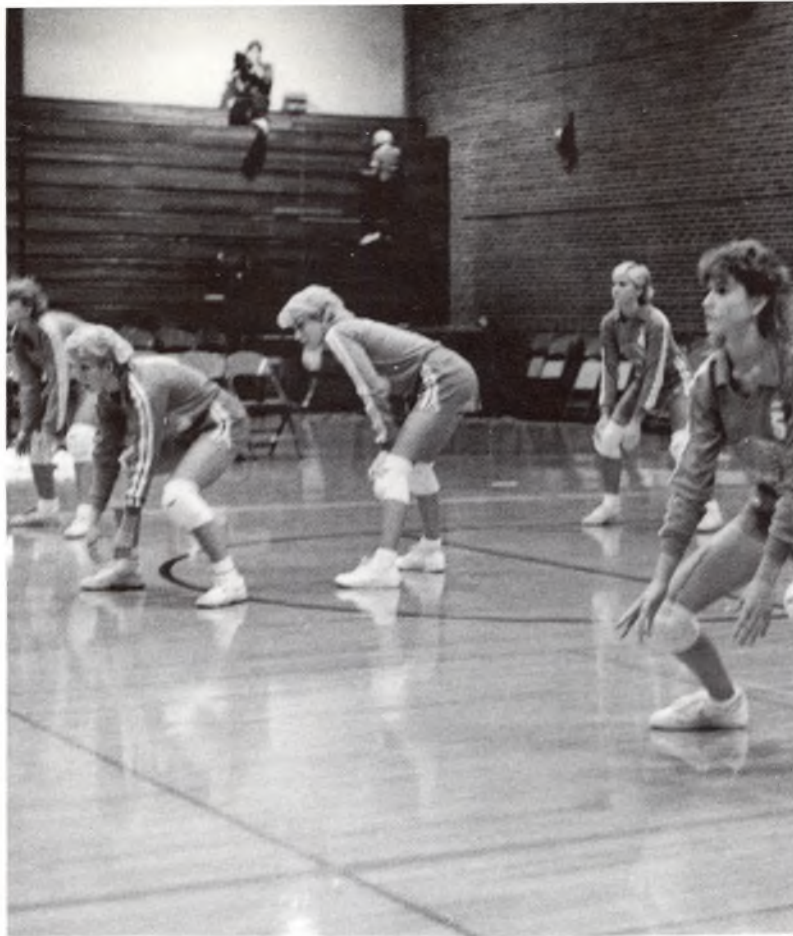
GIRLS' VARSITY VOLLEYBALL

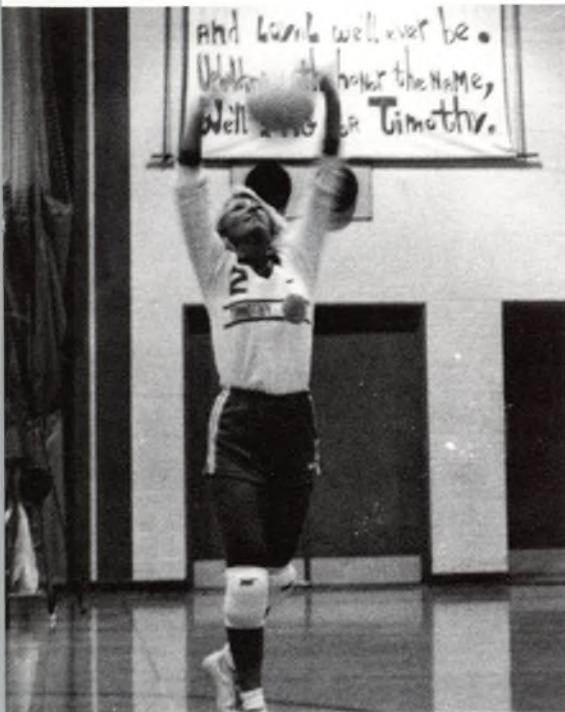

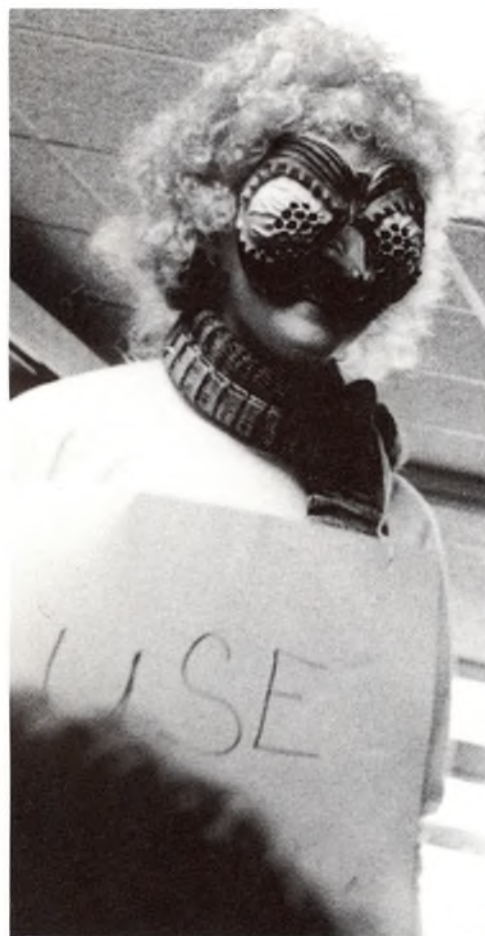

The 85-86 Pro-life Club began in October, 1985 with a "booster" chapel. Following the chapel, about 40 students signed up for the club. Mrs. Stulp agreed to be our sponsor.

Our first activity was the Hike for Life, a 10 mile hike throughout Elmhurst to raise funds for Crisis Pregnancy Services of DuPage County. Between the approximate 10 hikers from Timothy, we raised over 800 dollars for Crisis Pregnancy Services.

The Pro-life Club's main fundraising event was the TCHS Annual Bazaar, held in November. The club sponsored the game room for kids who came to the bazaar. We raised over \$300 and donated \$150 to Crisis Pregnancy Services to use for ads in high school papers, and \$150 to Bethany Christian Services.

During Spring Break, 5 club members went downtown to 30 S. Michigan Ave. to sidewalk counsel at a medical clinic that is notorious for the amount of abortions performed daily. We brought a total of 6 girls and their friends to Aid for Women, an abortion alternative agency.

On April 16, the Pro-life Club participated with songs, testimonies, and skits in the "Celebrate Life" program held after the evening worship service at Western Springs CRC. The program went very well.

The Pro-life Club performed their very own, slightly altered "Celebrate Life" program in chapel on May 22. This was an appropriate way to close the pro-life club's year because all year our goal was to promote a respect for all life, including the unborn and disabled; in doing the chapel, we were given a chance to celebrate the precious life God has given us.

We still sing from the same hymnal.

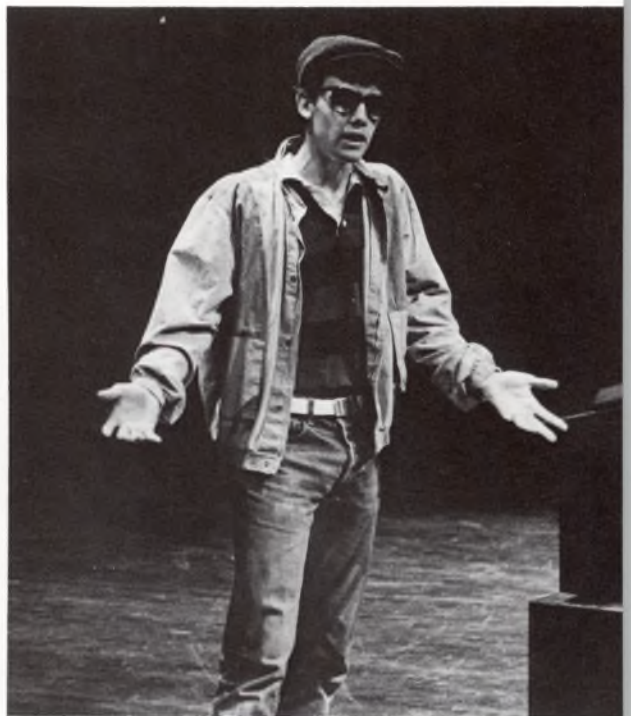

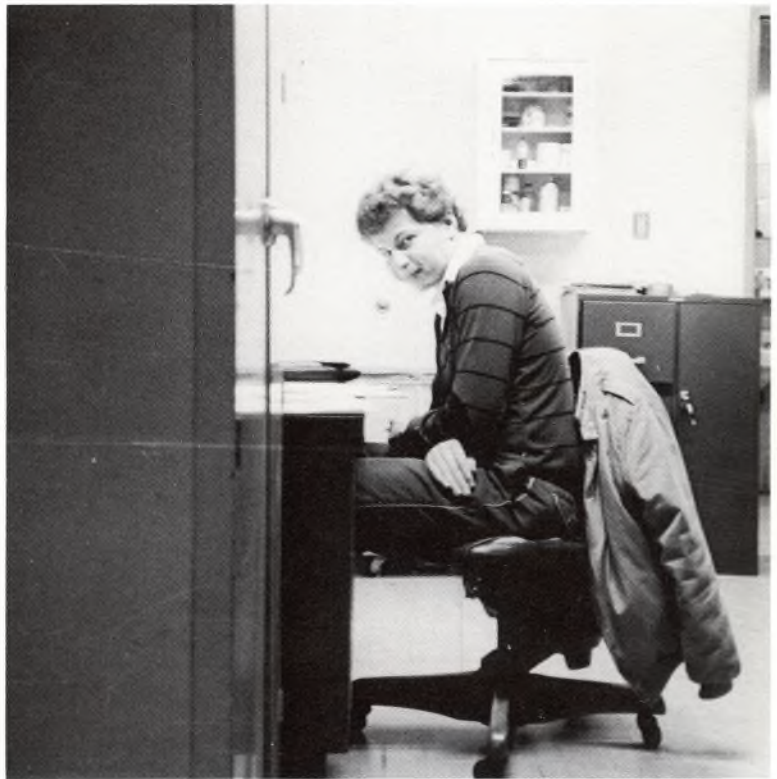


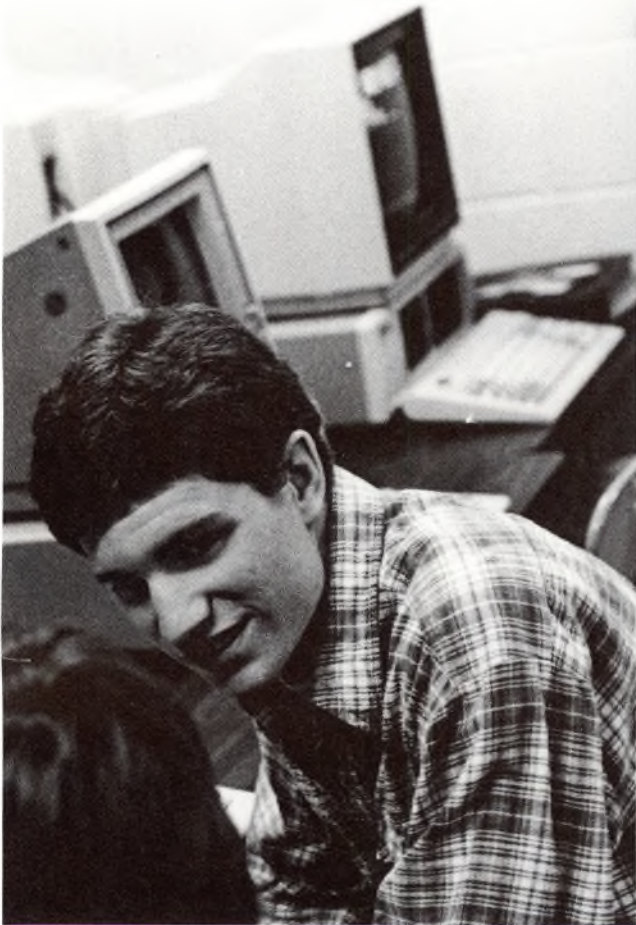


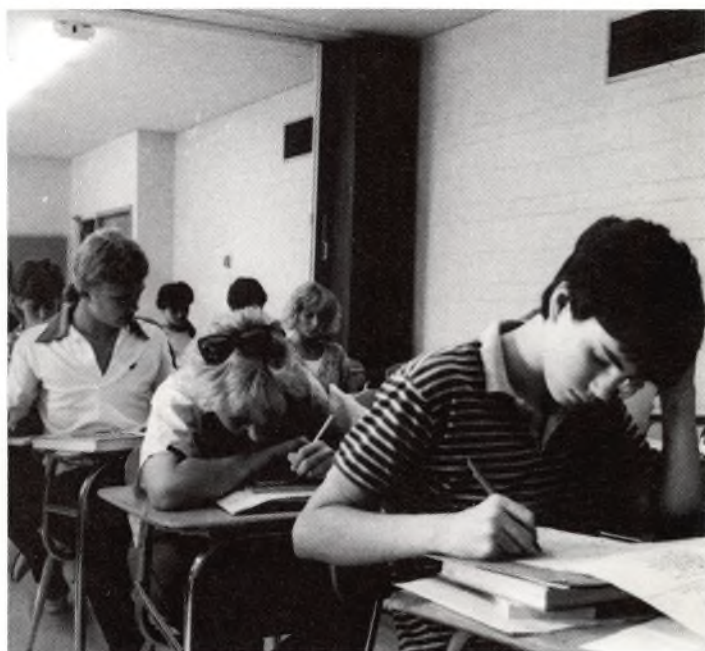










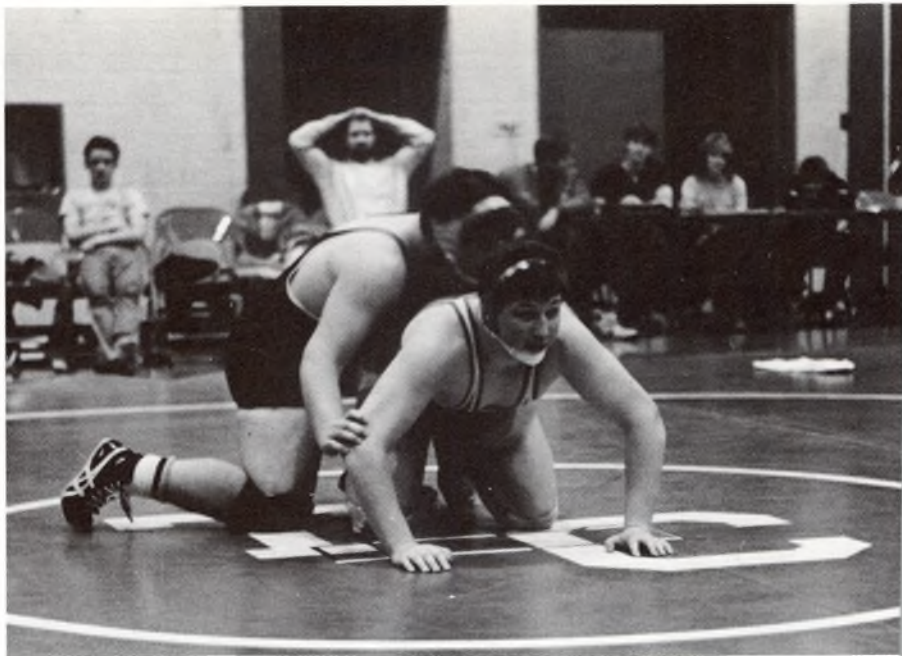


VARSITY WRESTLING

Disappointing because the team lost some wrestlers to injuries leaving them with 6 members to fill 12 possible weight classes. They finished 5th in the conference dual meets.

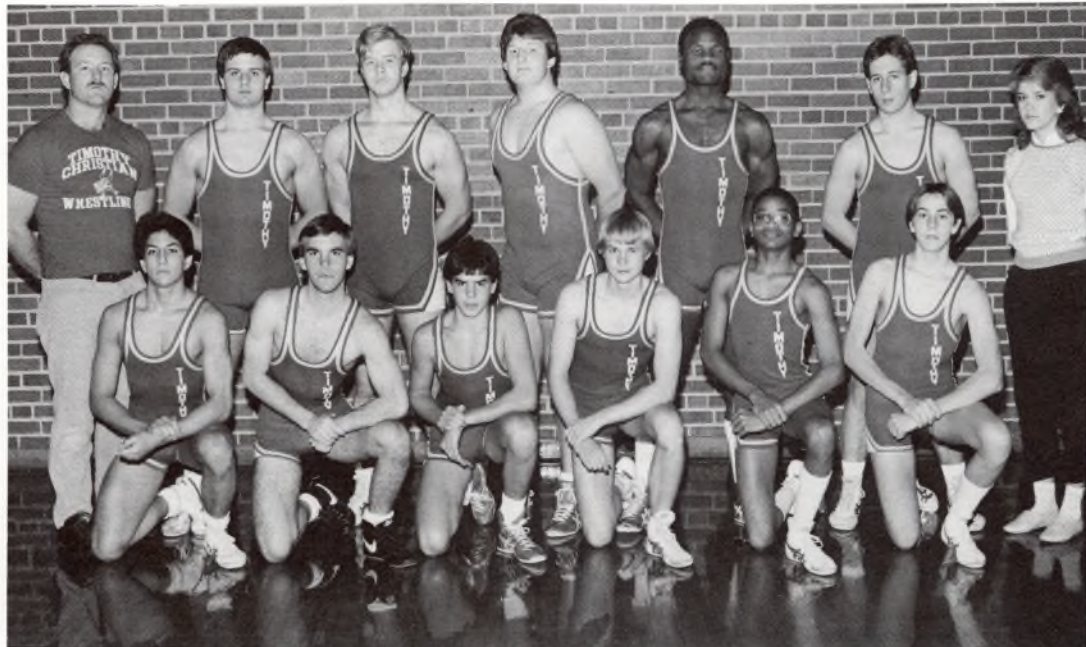

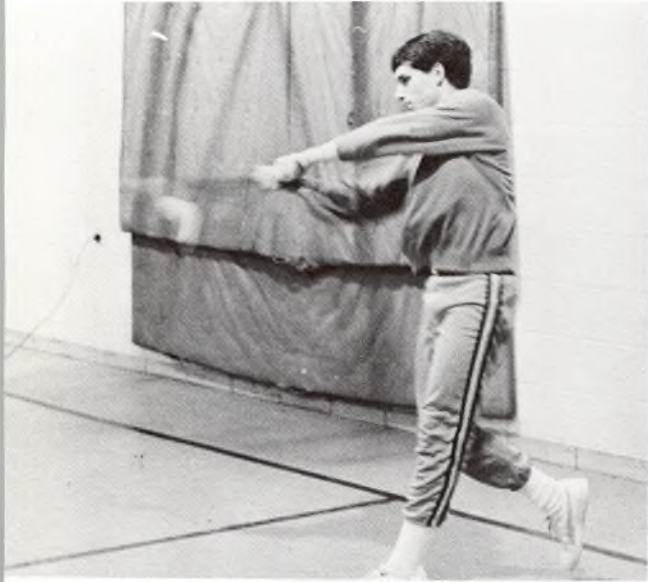














J.V. BOYS' BASEBALL

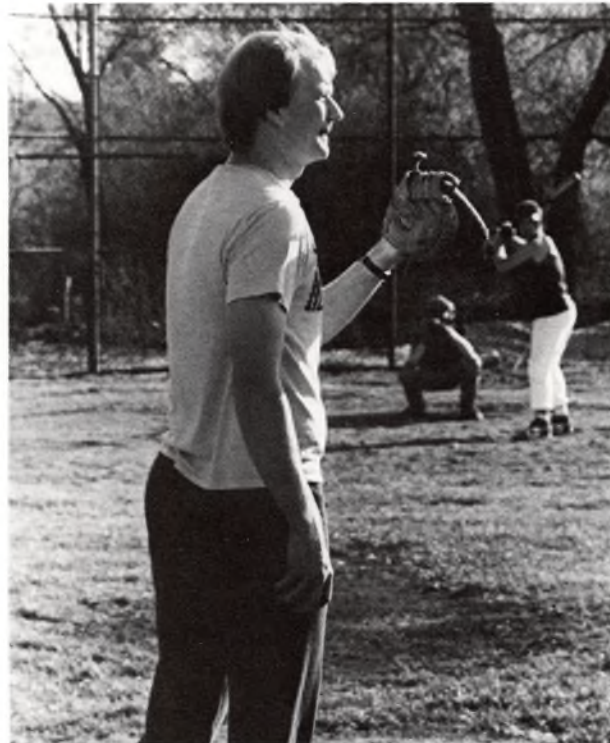
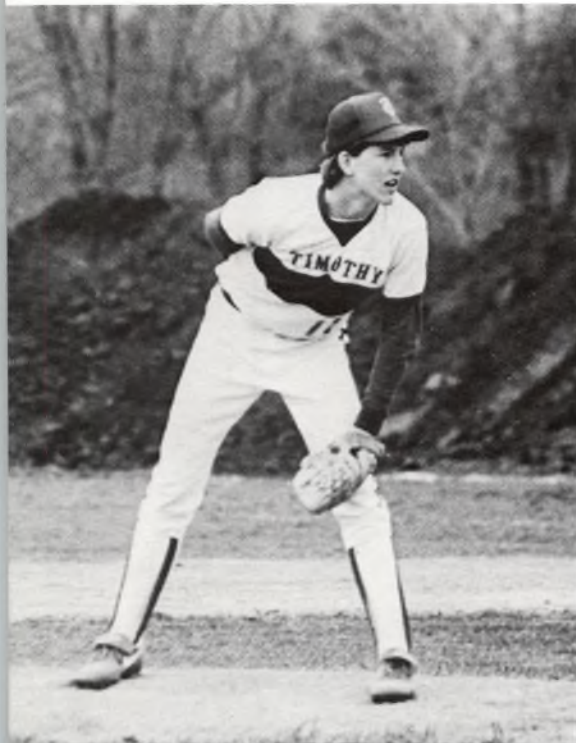

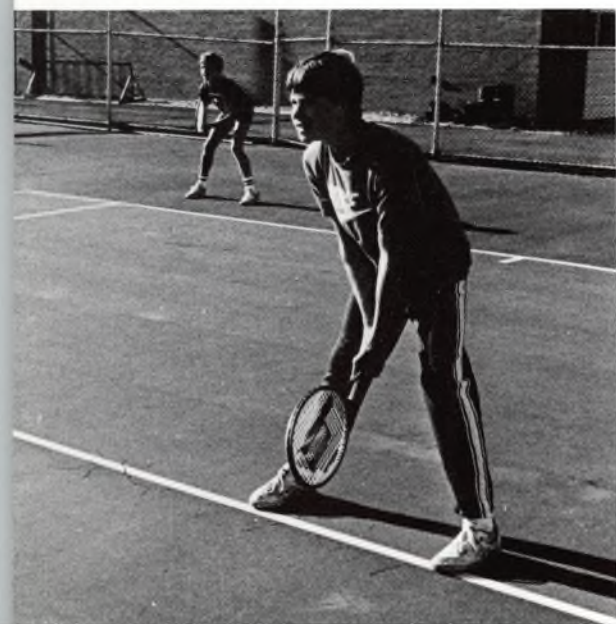


BOYS' TENNIS
