









Once upon a time...
It was the best of times...
It was a bright cold day in March,
1951...

Good stories have good opening lines, and are filled with adventures. All of us, looking back, can see that the stories of our lives are indeed filled with them. My teaching adventure started at Valley Christian HS in Cerritos, California. Forty-one years later it's ending here at Timothy Christian HS in Elmhurst, Illinois. A great many chapters fit into 41 years, but I will give a summary of the key parts here.

In my first years of Business Education I taught typing, shorthand, and office practice classes. As I close the book on my teaching career, I am teaching Computer Applications and Marketing.

Through all my classes I have stressed stewardship of God's resources. Psalm 24:1 says, "The earth is the LORD'S, and all it contains, the world, and those who dwell in it." I have worked to stress this truth to my students, challenging and encouraging

them to apply this truth to their lives as well.



Good stories also have good endings. If fact, the story of my life could begin and end with the same sentiment: "Thanks be to God."






























MRS. DAVID
